Schooling and human capital outcomes: creating capable successful citizens

Presentation by Professor David Hogan

The Research Forum

School systems typically rely on a narrow range of academic outcome or performance measures to assess the quality of student learning and to regulate student access to later educational opportunities and/or the labour market.

The Centre for Research in Pedagogy and Practice at the National Institute of Education in Singapore is now in the fourth year of a large student multi-cohort longitudinal study of a broad range of academic and "non-academic" outcome indicators that measure key capacities or competencies that young people are likely to need to successfully negotiate the rapidly changing institutional environments of the 21st century.

This presentation will include a brief overview of the rationale and the objectives of the project, the nature of the outcome measures, student performance on these indicators, the social demography of student performance, and the relationship between the academic and the "non-academic" measures.

The implications of the findings for assessment regimes and educational and labour market policy in the Australian context will be discussed

Professor David Hogan is Professor and Dean of Educational Research at Singapore's National Institute of Education, Singapore.

Professor Hogan's research interests include: pedagogical theory, sociology of student achievement, research design and quantitative analysis, education and social theory, education and political theory, political sociology of citizenship and education, and education and social stratification.
