Introduction

Aims of the project

The objectives of the survey were to collect information on the post-school destinations of Year 12 students in Queensland in order to assist:

- a) Parents and the wider public to know the achievements of students and to appreciate the range of options available to students
- b) Schools to review and plan their services for students, especially in the senior years of schooling
- c) School systems to review their education policies as they affect the transition from school to further study and employment
- d) Training bodies, universities, business and industry, local government and regional planners to plan their services.

Methodology

The *Next Step* Destination Survey 2006 was conducted by the Office of the Government Statistician (OGS) on behalf of the Department of Education and the Arts, in accordance with the privacy provisions of the *Statistical Returns Act 1896*.

The survey targeted students who completed Year 12 in Queensland in 2005, including students at Government schools, non-Government schools and TAFE secondary colleges. The targeted respondents were identified by means of a survey frame (or list) provided to the OGS by the Queensland Studies Authority (QSA). This list contained details for 40 004 in-scope respondents.

The survey was conducted between 27 March and 8 May 2006, approximately six months after the young people left school. Responses were predominantly collected via computer aided telephone interview (CATI) with paper-based surveys collected from a small number of students for whom telephone details were not available.

A total of 30 989 completed surveys were received. Of those, 1 111 were completed by returned mail and 29 878 by CATI.

Regional reports are based on statistical divisions used by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

The response rate for this region – Brisbane – was 79.3 per cent.

Please note that some survey participants did not provide information for particular survey questions. As a result, the number of responses shown in some tables may not reflect the totals reported for the main destinations appearing in Table 2.

Students were allocated to this region on the basis of the location of the school they attended in 2005. These data are shown in the Appendix (Table A2).

Main Findings – Brisbane

Destinations

More than nine in ten (93.1 per cent) Year 12 completers in this region were studying or in paid employment. (Figure 1)

Nearly seven in ten (70.2 per cent) continued in some recognised form of education and training in the year after they left school. (Figure 1)

More than four in ten were undertaking a university degree (43.2 per cent). (Figure 1)

More than a quarter (27.0 per cent) were studying vocational education and training (VET). (Figure 1)

Over six in ten of the campus-based VET students were studying at Certificate IV level or higher (9.4 per cent of Year 12 completers overall). (Figure 1)

Over one in nine (11.7 per cent) were undertaking employment-based training, either as an apprentice (7.3 per cent) or trainee (4.3 per cent). (Figure 1)

In addition to the above study destinations, a further 5.1 per cent of respondents from this region deferred a tertiary offer in 2006 (deferrers are shown in Figure 1 in their actual current destination and in Figure 3 as deferrers).

Nearly three in ten (29.8 per cent) did not enter post-school education or training and were either employed (22.9 per cent), looking for work (5.3 per cent) or neither working, seeking work or studying (1.6 per cent). (Figure 1)

Learning: education and training destinations

Amongst the 70.2 per cent of Year 12 completers continuing in some form of education or training the most common fields of study were Management and Commerce (e.g. Business, Tourism), Society and Culture (e.g. Arts, Law) and Engineering and Related Technologies. (Table 4)

The University of Queensland, Queensland University of Technology and Griffith University were the three tertiary institutions most commonly entered by Year 12 completers in Brisbane, accounting for over half of Year 12 completers (56.1 per cent) in post-school education and training destinations. (Table 5)

Earning: employment destinations

Of those young people working, nearly two thirds were in part-time employment (64.9 per cent), while 18.0 per cent were in full-time employment, 10.2 per cent were apprentices and 6.9 per cent were trainees. (Table 6)

Over one-half of all Year 12 completers in employment (53.5 per cent) were working in just two occupational groups — Sales Assistants and Food Handlers. Sales Assistants were the most common occupational group (38.2 per cent), with the next most common being Food Handlers (15.3 per cent), followed by Clerks, Receptionists and Secretaries (8.9 per cent). (Table 7)

Not learning or earning

The survey identified 5.3 per cent of Year 12 graduates who were seeking work. (Figure 1)

Less than one in every fifty Year 12 graduates were neither in a study destination nor seeking work (1.6 per cent). This group includes those with a disability or health condition, travelling or waiting for their course to commence. (Figure 1)

The key reasons given for not continuing in study were that young people wanted a break from study (for example to travel) or were not interested in further study. (Table 9)

The next most common group of reasons for not studying relate to economic and financial considerations. Many Year 12 graduates cited work commitments for not studying or were working in order to finance future study and some were concerned with the cost of studying. Others did not feel ready for any more study. (Table 9)

A third group of reasons were related to accessibility to study, reflecting concerns about family commitments, disabilities and perceived academic barriers. (Table 9)

Different people, different pathways

The survey found different patterns for different groups of young people.

Sex

There were significant differences in the destinations of males and females. In particular:

Females were more likely than males to enter a university degree course (48.1 per cent compared to 38.1 per cent of males), but less likely to enrol in campus-based (i.e. not apprenticeships or traineeships) VET programs (16.5 per cent compared to 14.2 per cent of males). (Table 2)

Males were more likely to enter university than VET programs (38.1 per cent for university compared to 30.9 per cent for VET), while females were twice as likely to enter university as VET programs (48.1 per cent for university compared to 23.3 per cent for VET). (Table 2)

Males were seven times more likely than females to enter an apprenticeship, while females were more likely to commence a traineeship. (Table 2)

Females were more than three times as likely to study in the field of Education and twice as likely to study in the field of Health. They were more likely than males to study in the fields of Management and Commerce (e.g. Business, Tourism), Society and Culture (e.g. Arts, Law), Creative Arts and Food, Hospitality and Personal Services. (Table 4)

Males were ten times as likely as females to enrol in Engineering and Related Technologies courses, and seven times as likely to enrol in Information Technology. They were five times more likely than females to enrol in Architecture and Building courses. (Table 4)

Similar enrolment patterns were seen in the fields of Natural and Physical Sciences, Mixed Field Programs and Agriculture, Environmental and Related Studies. (Table 4)

Females were more likely than males to be working in part-time jobs (72.9 per cent compared to 55.9 per cent), but less likely to be working in full-time jobs (16.7 per cent compared to 19.4 per cent of males). (Table 6)

Students of VET in schools

The survey found a link between VET studies at school and destinations after school.

Three in ten Year 12 graduates in this region left school with a VET qualification (32.7 per cent), while 4.5 per cent were school-based apprentices or trainees (SATs). (Table 12)

Those with a VET qualification were less likely to enrol in a university degree course than others (23.4 per cent compared to 52.8 per cent). However, they had higher rates of transition to employment-based training (19.4 per cent compared to 7.9 per cent). They were also more likely to enter employment with no further education and training (30.4 per cent compared to 19.3 per cent). (Table 12)

School-based apprentices and trainees were three times as likely to undertake apprenticeships and traineeships after school as other Year 12 completers (33.0 per cent compared to 10.7 per cent). (Table 12)

Indigenous

Indigenous Year 12 completers were less likely than their non-Indigenous peers to enrol at university (21.2 per cent compared to 43.5 per cent). Nonetheless, 36 Indigenous young people who completed the survey commenced university studies in 2006. (Table 14)

Indigenous students were twice as likely to be an apprentice or trainee (24.1 per cent compared to 11.5 per cent) and more likely to have a main destination of working (25.9 per cent compared to 22.9 per cent). (Table 14)

Indigenous Year 12 completers were just as likely as their non-Indigenous counterparts to enrol in campus-based VET courses (15.2 per cent compared to 15.3 per cent). (Table 14)

Indigenous Year 12 completers were more likely to be seeking work as their non-Indigenous peers (11.2 per cent compared to 5.2 per cent). (Table 14)

LBOTE

LBOTE students were more likely than other Year 12 graduates to enrol at university (54.8 per cent compared to 42.4 per cent) and more likely to enrol in campus-based VET courses (24.8 per cent compared to 14.7 per cent). (Table 15)

LBOTE students were less likely than other Year 12 graduates to be in employment-based training (3.3 per cent compared to 12.3 per cent). They were also less likely to enter employment without further education and training (10.1 per cent compared to 23.8 per cent). (Table 15)

Socio-economic status

Transition to post-school education and training was strongly associated with socio-economic status (SES), increasing consistently from 60.6 per cent for the lowest SES quartile to 77.3 per cent for the highest SES quartile. (Table 16)

Comparisons

Year 12 completers in Brisbane had similar post-schooling destinations to all metropolitan and Queensland Year 12 completers, although more were likely to enter university in Brisbane. (Figure 2)

Year 12 completers not in education or training in Brisbane had similar employment destinations to metropolitan Year 12 completers generally, and to Year 12 completers statewide. (Figure 5)

The occupational destinations of Year 12 completers in Brisbane resemble those of Year 12 completers statewide. (Table 7)

The industry categories of Year 12 completers in Brisbane resemble those of Year 12 completers statewide. (Table 8)

The main reasons given for not studying by Brisbane Year 12 completers resemble those of metropolitan and statewide respondents. (Table 10)

The main reasons given for not seeking work by Brisbane Year 12 completers not in the labour market resemble those of metropolitan and statewide respondents. (Table 11)

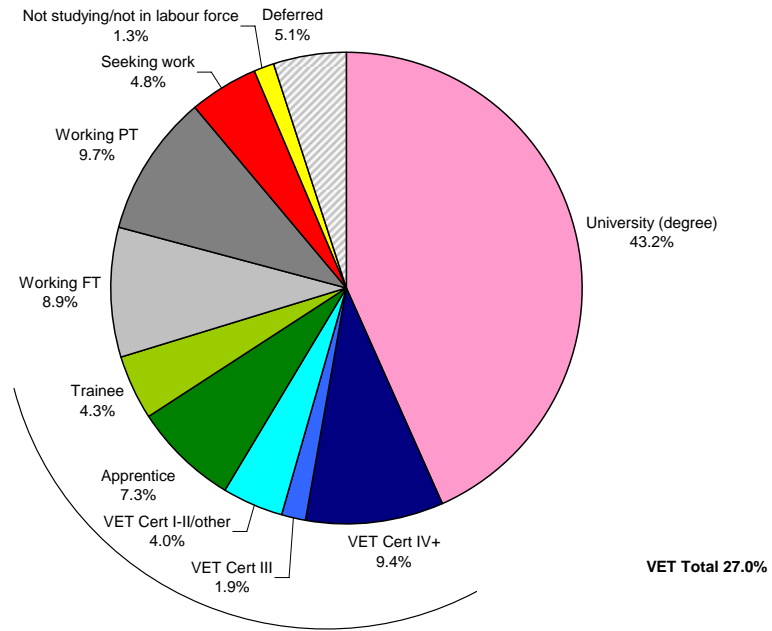


Figure 4 Comparison of main destinations of Year 12 completers, Brisbane, 2005 and 2006

Comparisons between the 2005 and 2006 destinations reveal a broadly similar pattern. (Figure 4)

Main destinations

All respondents were categorised into their main destination, as Outlined in Table 1. Tertiary students are assigned to the study categories regardless of their labour force status (i.e. they may also be working or even looking for work).

Figure 1 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Brisbane, 2006

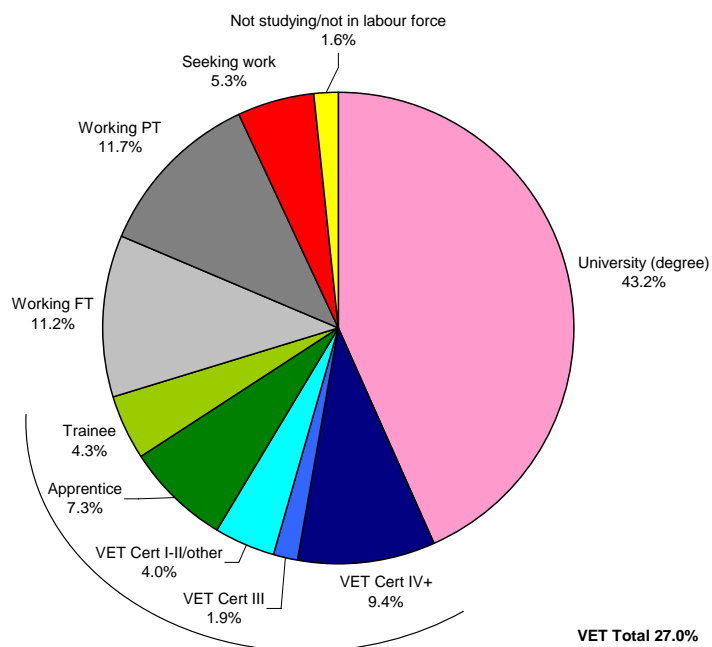

Figure 2 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

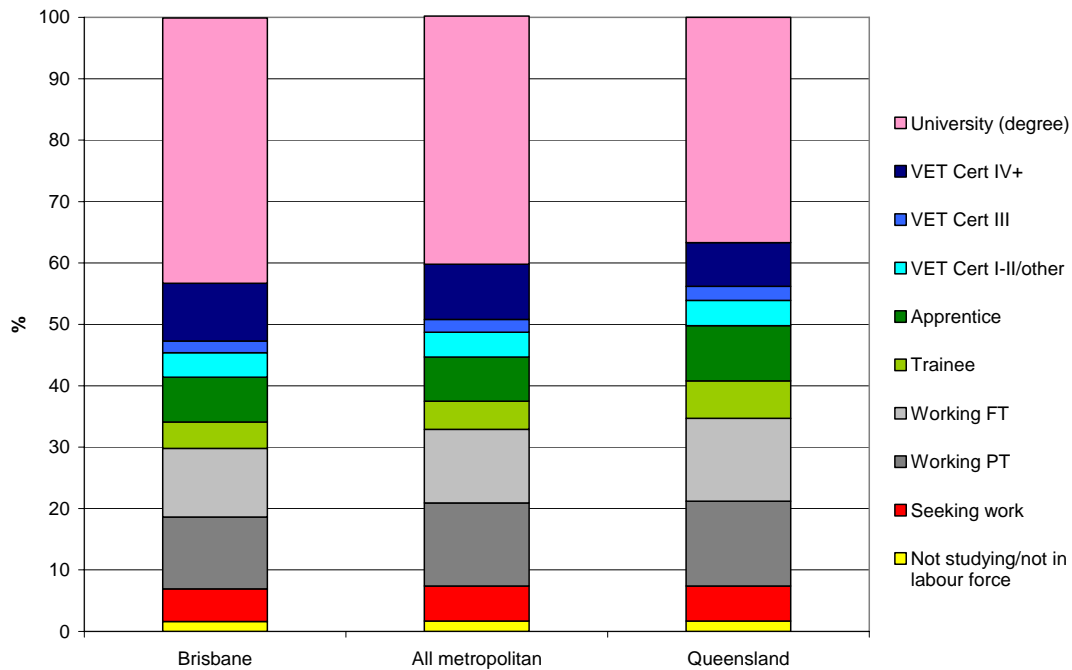

Figure 3 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, with deferrals identified, Brisbane, 2006

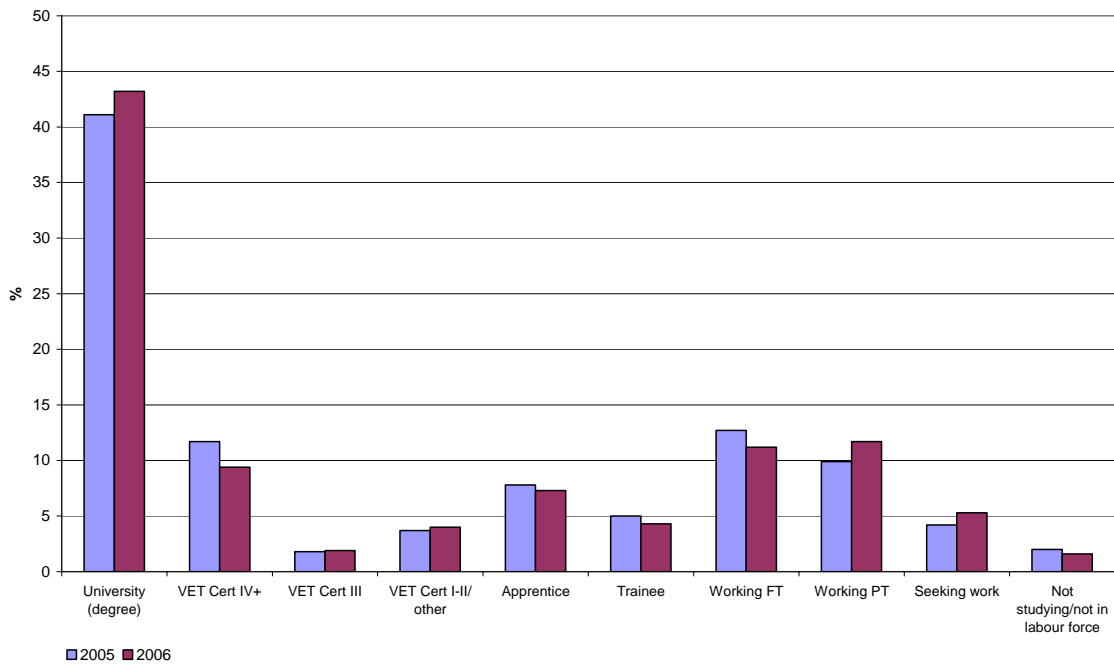

Figure 5 Employment destinations of Year 12 completers not in education or training, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

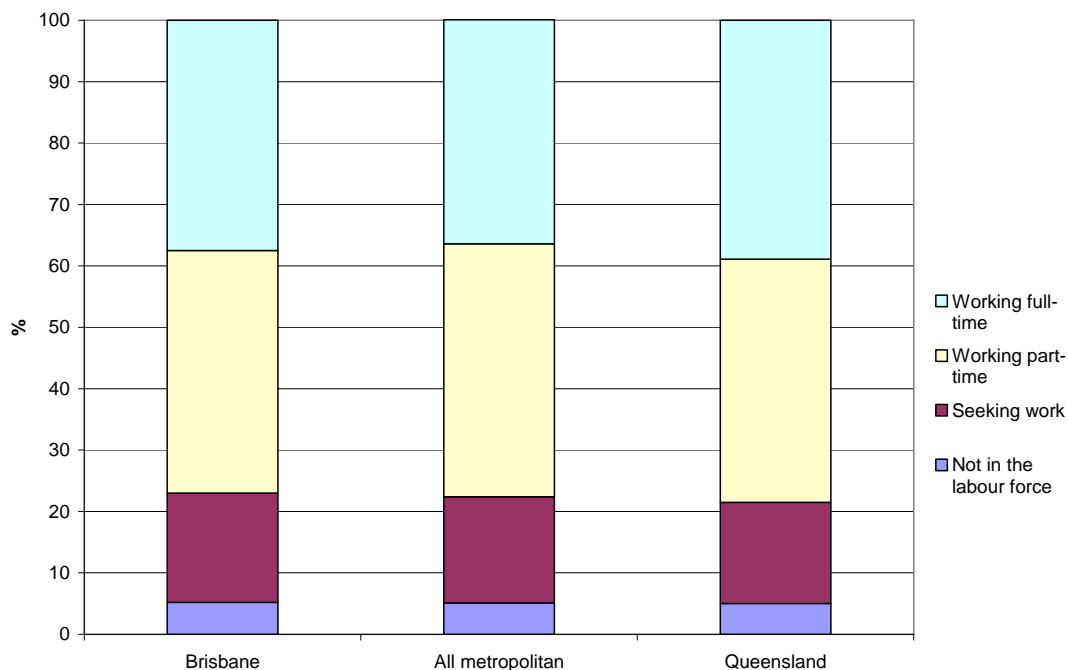

Figure 6 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Brisbane City, 2006

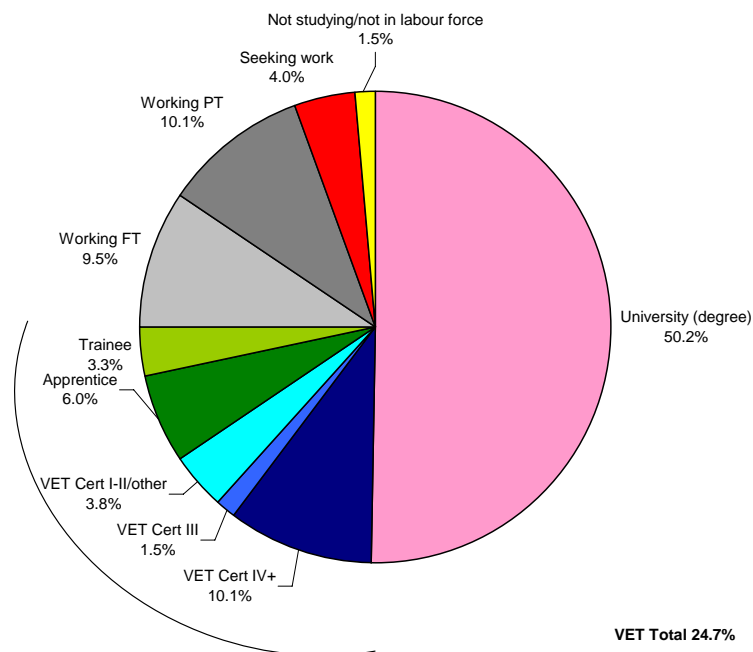

Figure 7 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Brisbane City, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

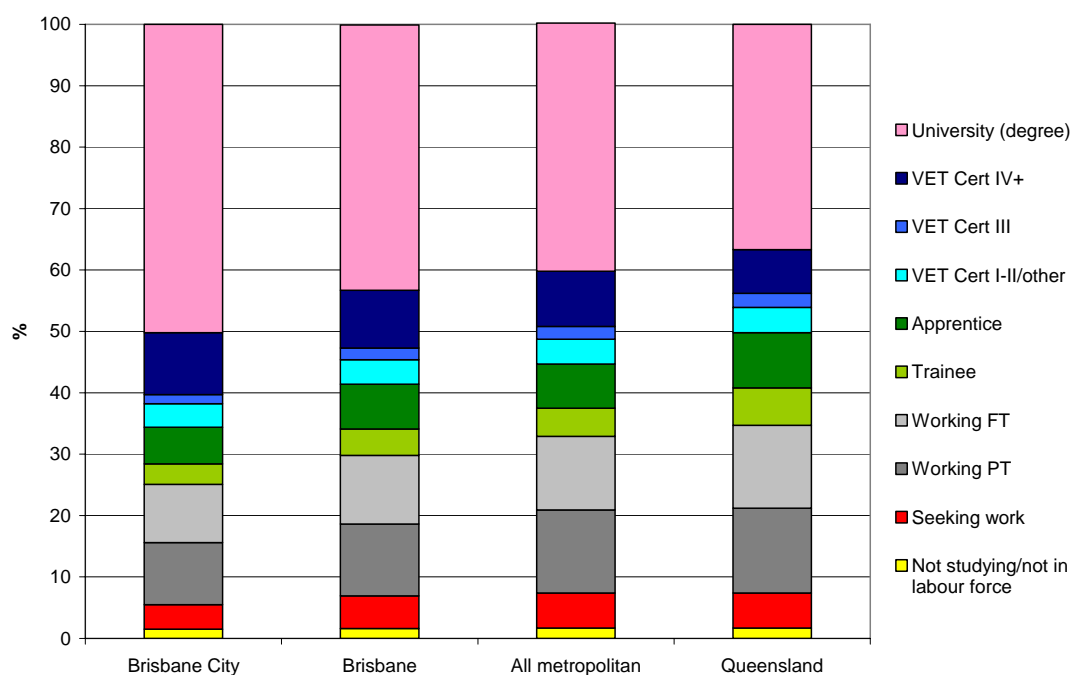

Figure 8 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Caboolture Shire, 2006

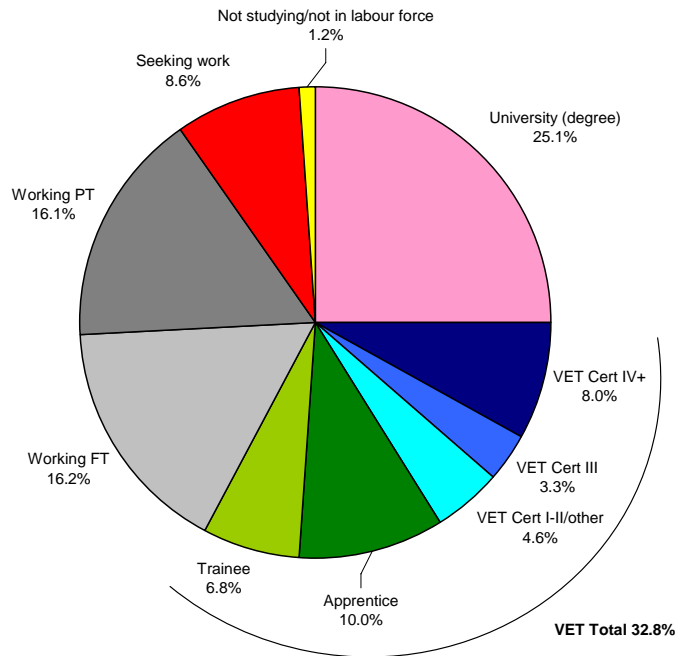

Figure 9 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Caboolture Shire, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

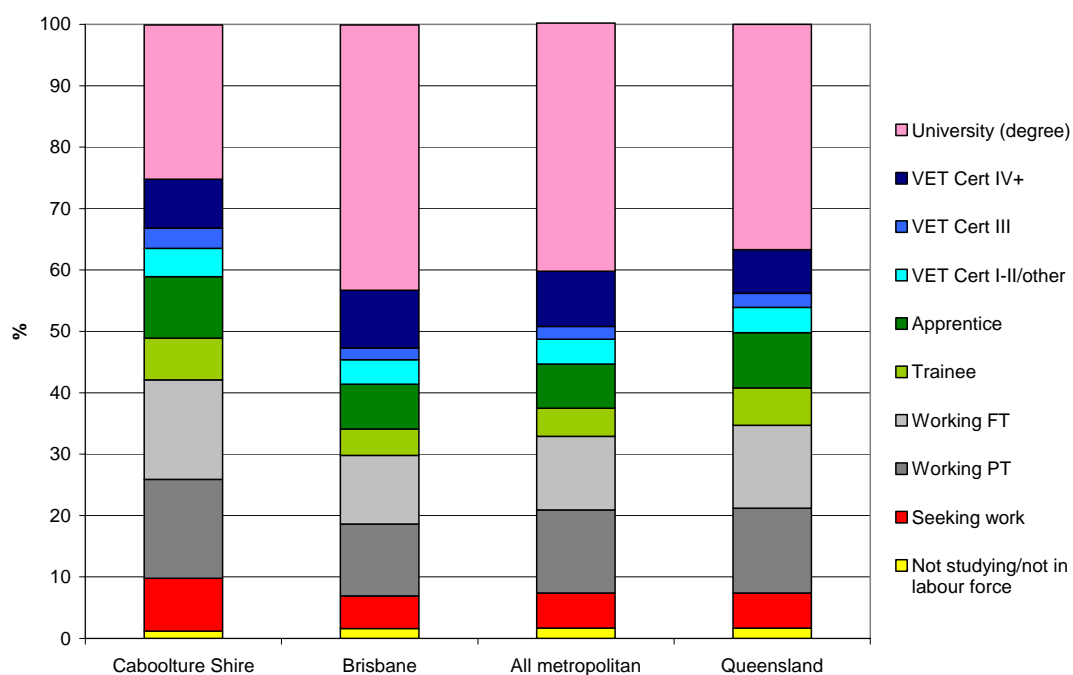

Figure 10 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Gold Coast City Part A, 2006

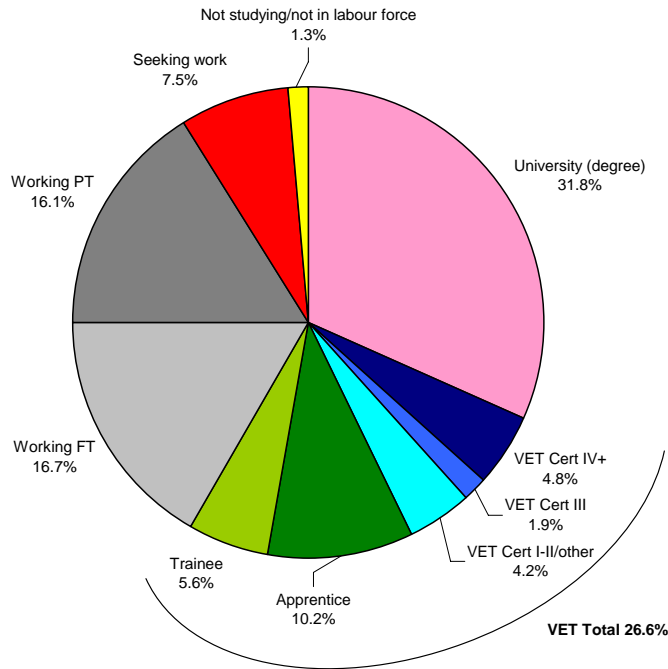

Figure 11 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Gold Coast City Part A, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

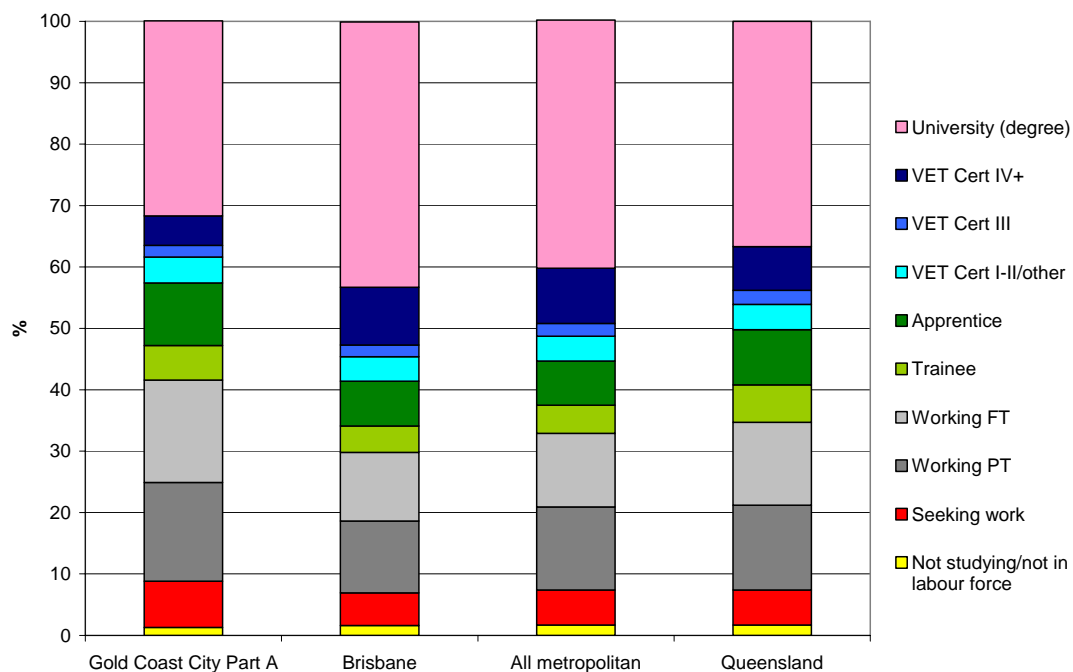

Figure 12 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Ipswich City, 2006

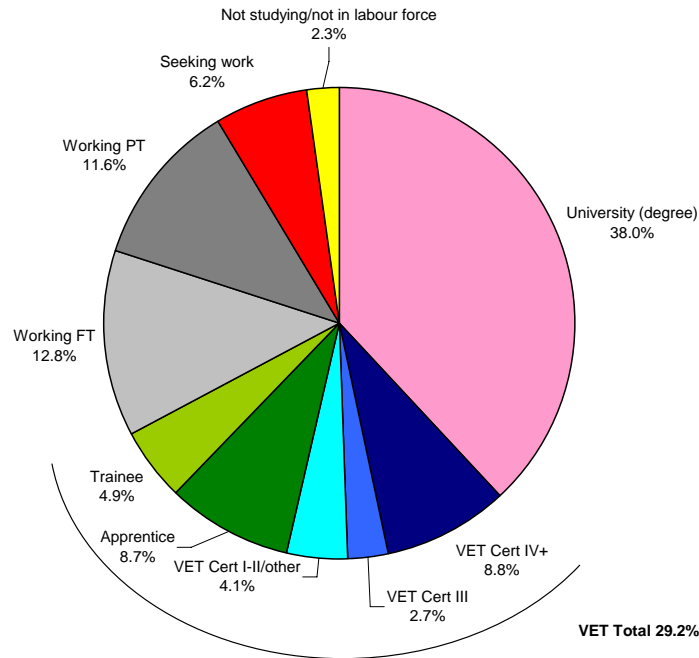

Figure 13 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Ipswich City, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

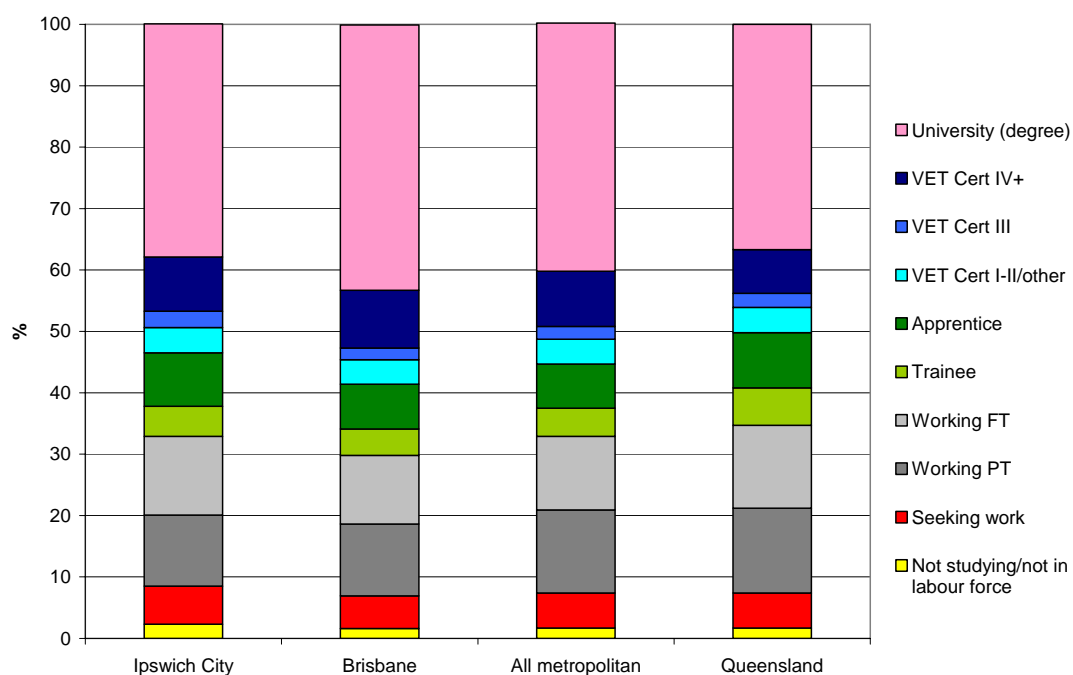

Figure 14 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Logan City/Beaudesert, 2006

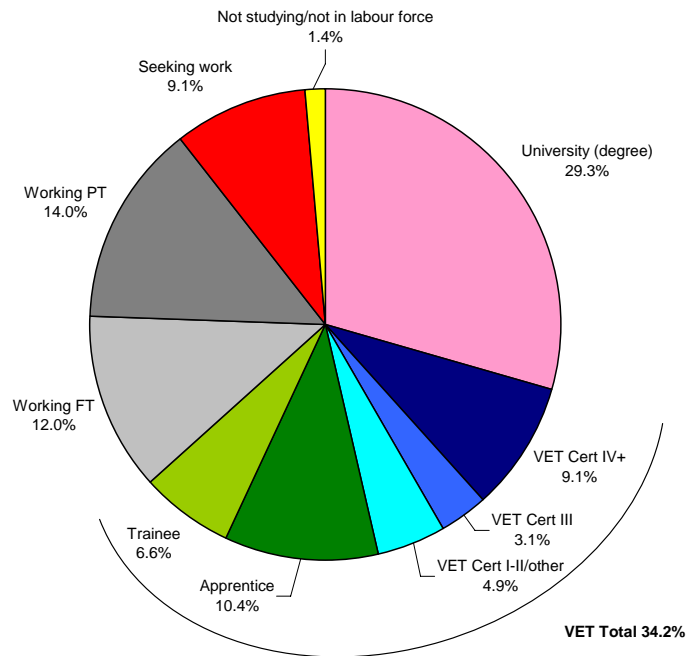

Figure 15 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Logan City/Beaudesert, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

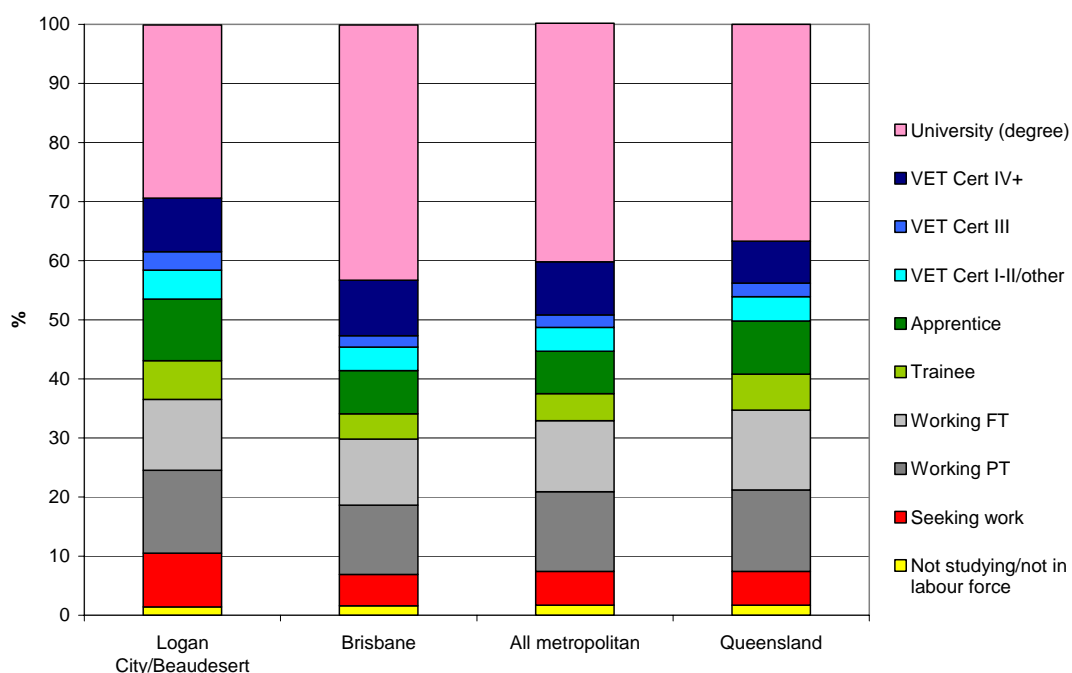

Figure 16 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Pine Rivers Shire, 2006

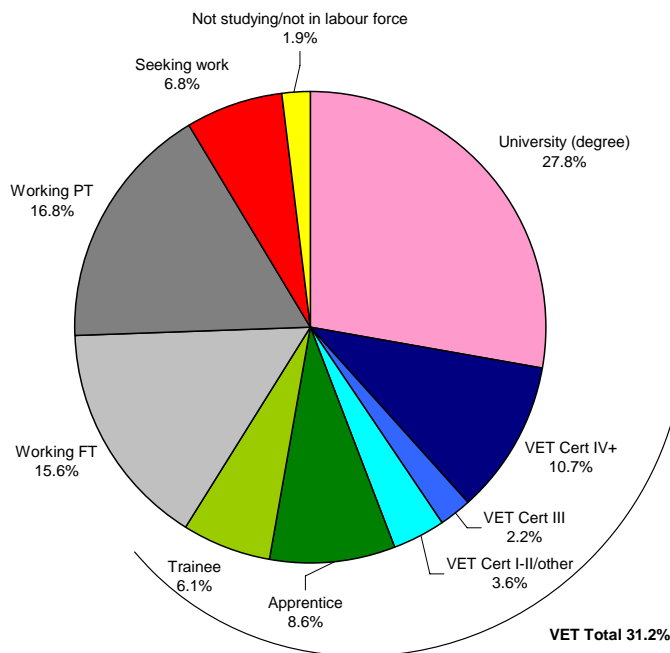

Figure 17 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Pine Rivers Shire, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

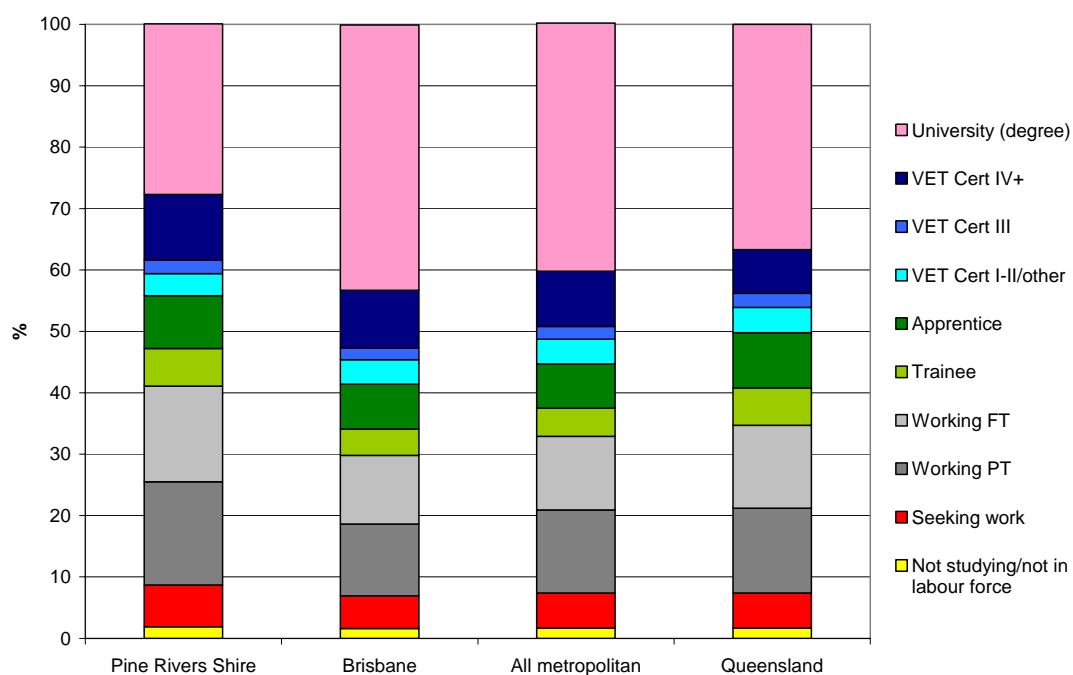

Figure 18 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Redcliffe City, 2006

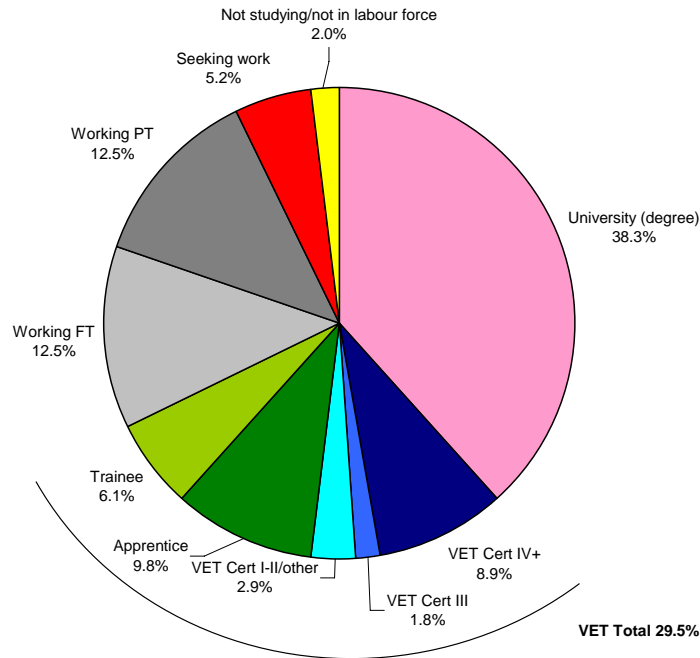

Figure 19 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Redcliffe City, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

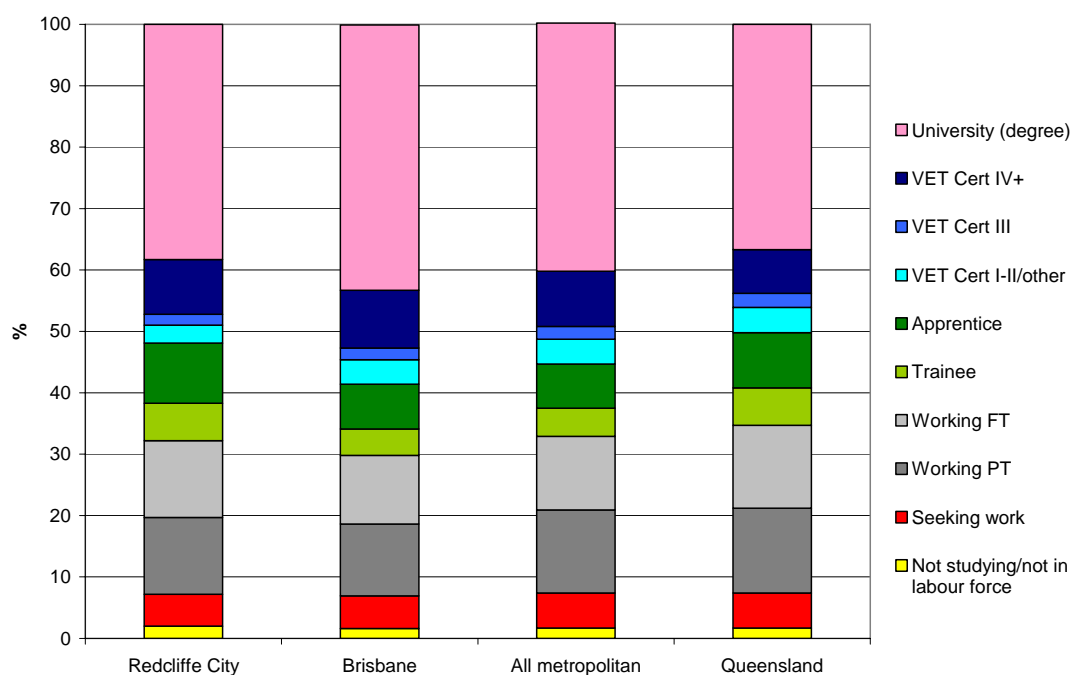

Figure 20 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Redland Shire, 2006

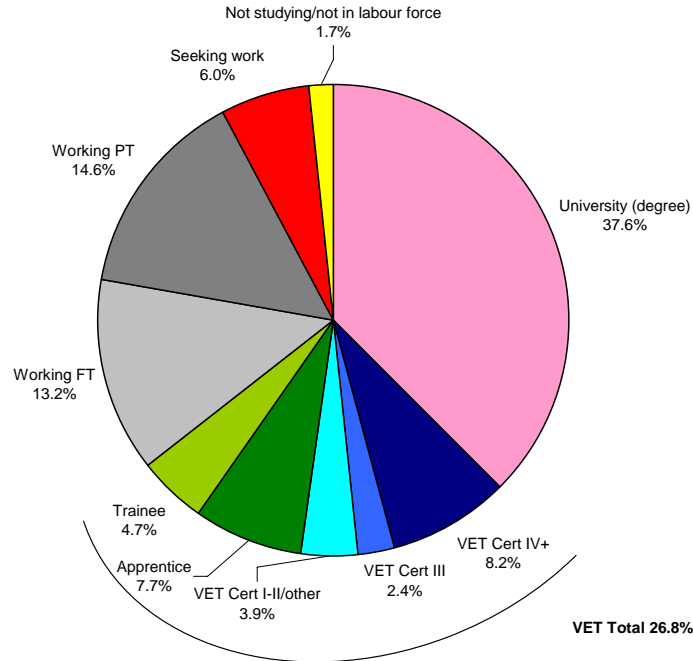

Figure 21 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Redland Shire, Brisbane, All Metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

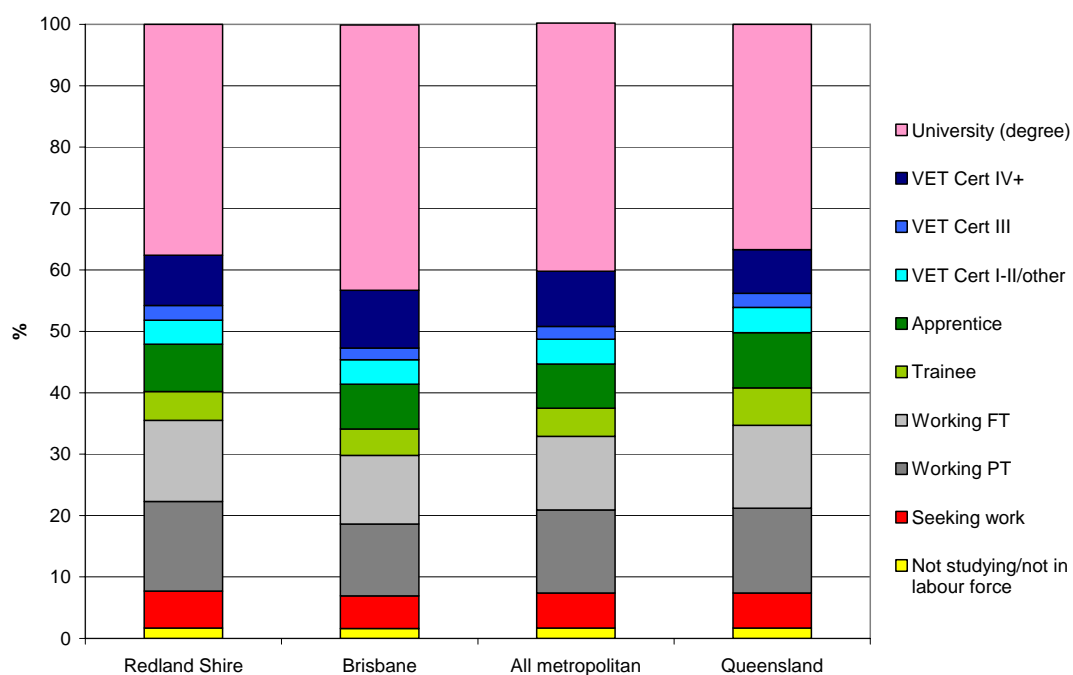

Figure A1A Employment destinations of Year 12 completers not in education or training, All Sub-regions within Brisbane, All metropolitan and Queensland, 2006

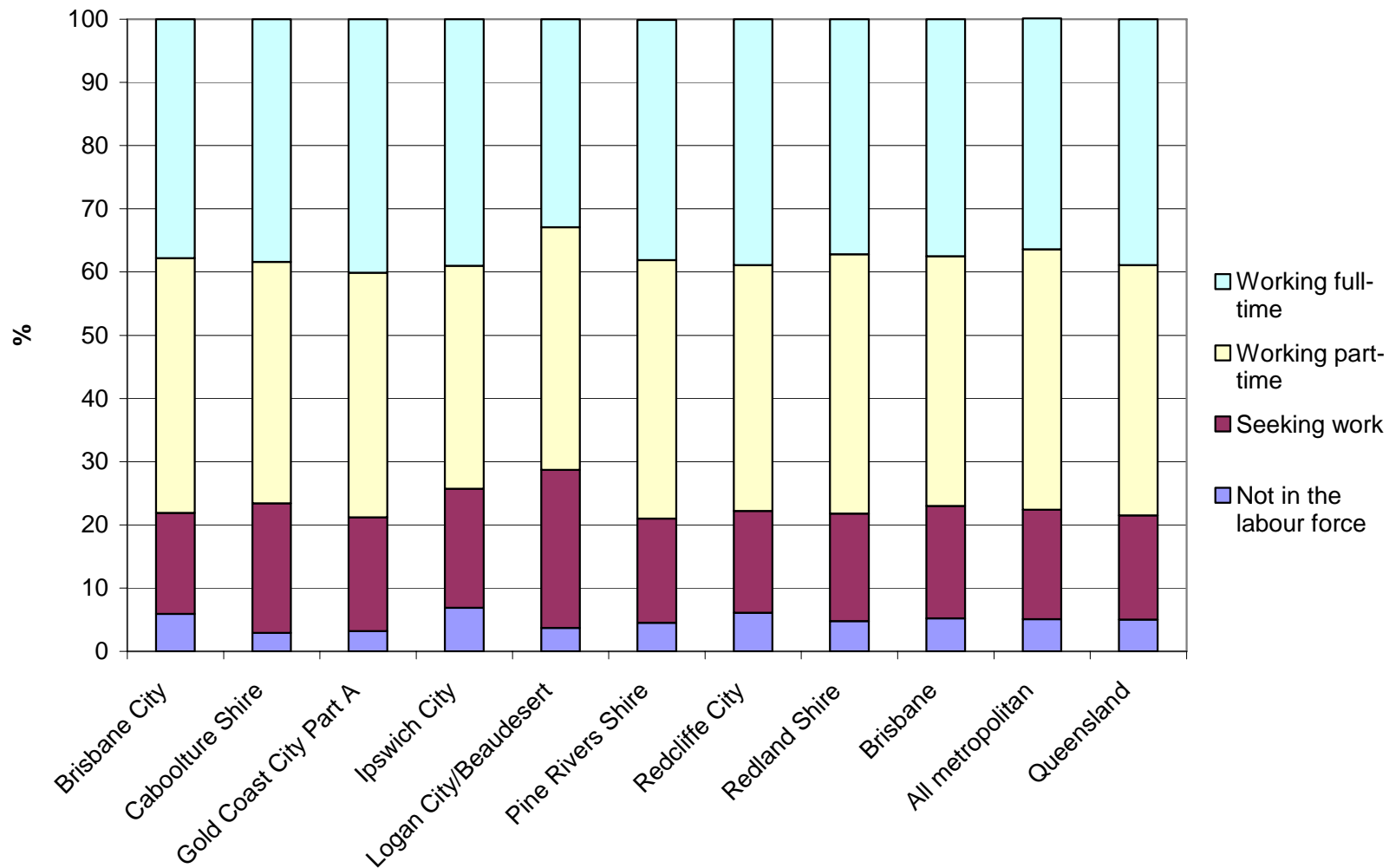

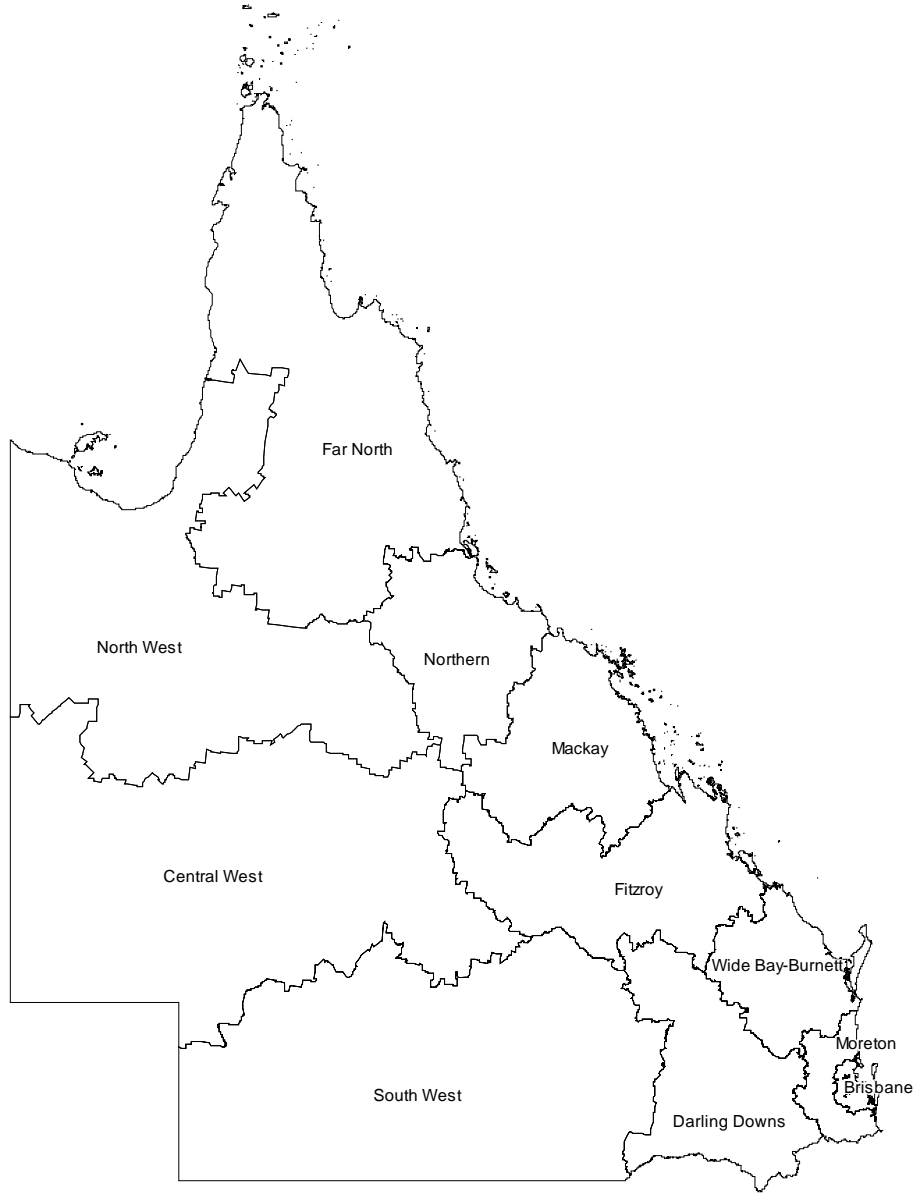
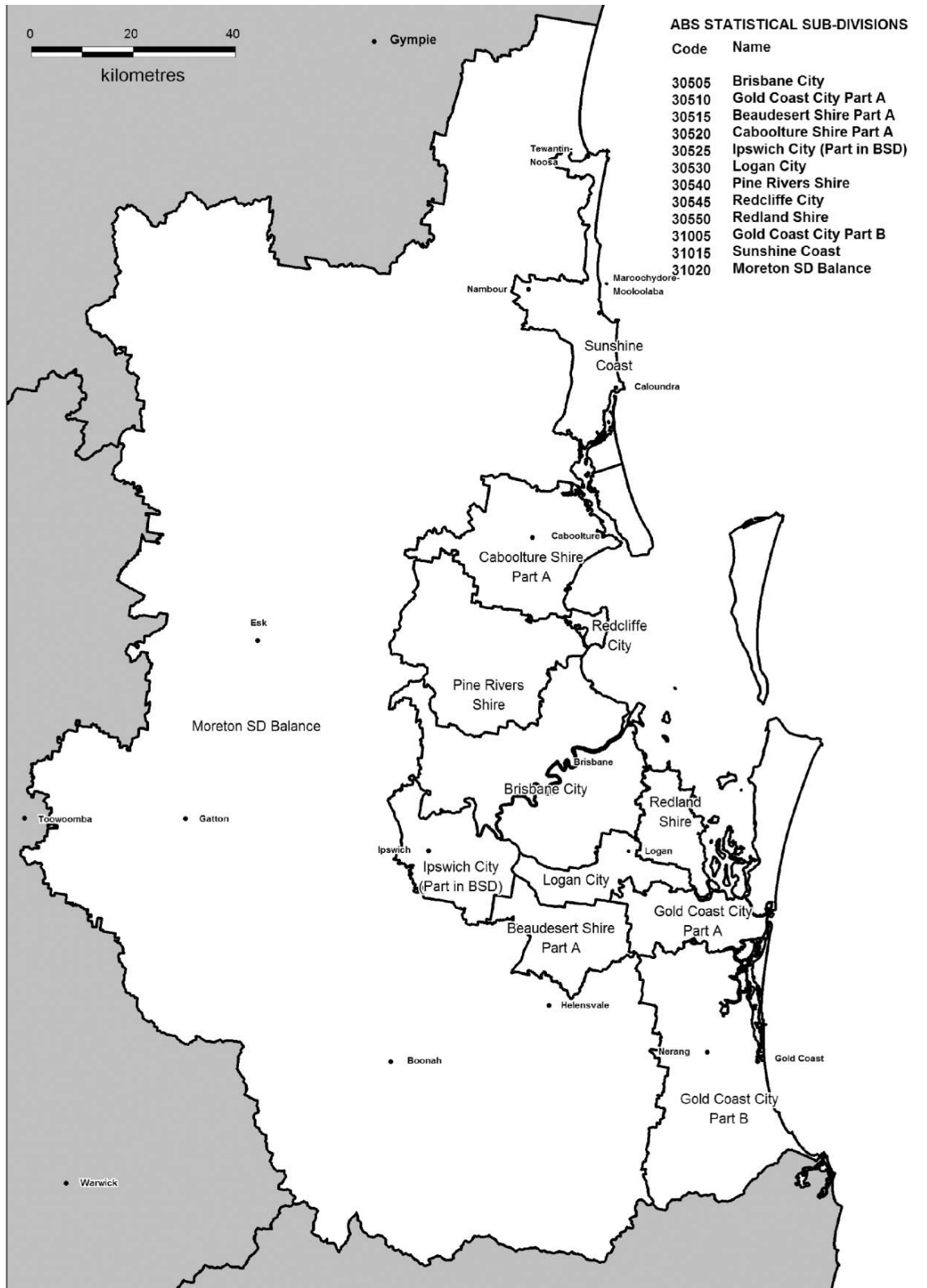


Figure A2B Moreton and Brisbane Statistical Divisions and Statistical Sub-divisions, ABS, 2005
