Introduction

Aims of the project

The *Next Step* survey is an annual survey of every student who completed Year 12 in the previous year in Queensland, in Government and non-Government schools. The survey results show the initial study and work destinations of young people after completing school.

The objectives of the survey are to assist:

- parents and the wider public to know the achievements of students and to appreciate the range of options available to students
- schools to review and plan their services for students, especially in the senior years of schooling
- school systems to review their education policies as they affect the transition from school to further study and employment
- training bodies, universities, business and industry, local government and regional planners to plan their services.

The survey follows the destinations of students who completed Year 12 at Government schools, Catholic schools, independent schools and TAFE secondary colleges.

Methodology

The *Next Step* 2008 survey was conducted by the Department of Education, Training and the Arts through the Office of the Government Statistician (OGS), in accordance with the privacy provisions of the *Statistical Returns Act 1896*.

The survey targeted students who completed Year 12 in Queensland in 2007, including students at Government schools, non-Government schools and TAFE secondary colleges. All students who were awarded a Senior Certificate or Certificate of Post-Compulsory School Education (CPCSE) were included. The Senior Certificate is a formal record of achievement issued at the end of Year 12 to all students who complete at least one approved subject. The CPCSE is a separate certificate for students with an impairment or difficulties in learning that are not primarily due to socioeconomic, cultural and/or linguistic factors.

The targeted students were identified by means of a survey frame (or list) provided to the OGS by the Queensland Studies Authority (QSA). This list contained details for 41 889 Year 12 completers who were deemed in-scope for this survey.

The survey was conducted between 2 April and 17 May 2008, approximately six months after the young people left school. This timing was designed to be after tertiary education places for 2008 were accepted, and while most of these young people were still contactable via their 2007 home address details.

Responses were predominantly collected via computer-assisted telephone interviewing (CATI) with paper-based surveys collected from a small number of students for whom telephone details were not available. The average time for a completed interview was less than four minutes.

Prior to the survey, all Year 12 completers were sent a letter from the Queensland Minister for Education and Training advising them of the survey. Those without

usable telephone details but with a usable Australian or international address were sent a printed copy of the questionnaire and a reply paid envelope.

Completed paper-based questionnaires were returned directly to OGS for processing and data entry. All responding Year 12 graduates went into a draw for a chance to win one of several prizes offered as an incentive to encourage survey participation.

At the close of the survey, nearly all non-responding students for whom telephone numbers were available had received at least six attempts of contact. Non-responding students without telephone numbers were mailed two copies of the questionnaire. A total of 33 568 completed surveys were received. Of these, 306 were completed by paper-based questionnaire and 33 262 by CATI.

Regional reports are based on statistical divisions used by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

The response rate for this region – Brisbane – was 81.3 per cent.

Please note that some survey participants did not provide information for particular survey questions. As a result, the number of responses shown in some tables may not reflect the totals reported for the main destinations appearing in Table 2.

Students were allocated to this region on the basis of the location of the school they attended in 2007. A list of schools from this region is shown in the Appendix (Table A1A).

Main Findings – Brisbane

Destinations

More than nine in ten (93.5 per cent) Year 12 completers in this region were studying or in paid employment. (Figure 1)

More than six in ten (66.2 per cent) continued in some recognised form of education and training in the year after they left school. (Figure 1)

More than four in ten were undertaking a university degree (41.5 per cent). (Figure 1)

Nearly a quarter (24.7 per cent) were studying vocational education and training (VET). (Figure 1)

Over six in ten of the campus-based VET students were studying at Certificate IV level or higher (8.0 per cent of Year 12 completers overall). (Figure 1)

More than one in ten (11.9 per cent) were undertaking employment-based training, either as an apprentice (7.9 per cent) or trainee (4.0 per cent). (Figure 1)

In addition to the above study destinations, a further 6.2 per cent of Year 12 graduates from this region deferred a tertiary offer in 2008 (deferrers are shown in Figure 1 in their actual current destination and in Figure 3 as deferrers).

Three in ten (33.8 per cent) did not enter post-school education or training and were either employed (27.3 per cent), looking for work (5.1 per cent) or neither working, seeking work or studying (1.4 per cent). (Figure 1)

Learning: education and training destinations

Amongst the 66.2 per cent of Year 12 completers continuing in some form of education or training the most common fields of study were Management and Commerce (e.g. Business, Tourism), Engineering and Related Technologies, Society and Culture (e.g. Arts, Law), Health and Creative Arts. (Table 4)

The University of Queensland, Queensland University of Technology and Griffith University were the three tertiary institutions most commonly entered by Year 12 completers, accounting for over half of Year 12 completers (57.1 per cent) in post-school education and training destinations. (Table 5)

Earning: employment destinations

Of those Year 12 graduates working, nearly two thirds were in part-time employment (63.5 per cent), while 21.2 per cent were in full-time employment, 10.2 per cent were apprentices and 5.2 per cent were trainees. (Table 6)

Over six in ten of all Year 12 completers in employment (61.1 per cent) were working in just three occupational groups — Sales Assistants, Food Handlers and Clerks, Receptionists and Secretaries. Sales Assistants were the most common occupational group (35.2 per cent), with the next most common being Food Handlers (14.3 per cent), followed by Clerks, Receptionists and Secretaries (11.6 per cent). (Table 7)

Not learning or earning

The survey identified 5.1 per cent of Year 12 graduates who were seeking work. (Figure 1)

Less than one in every fifty Year 12 graduates were neither studying nor seeking work (1.4 per cent). This group includes those with a disability or health condition, and those travelling or waiting for their course to commence. (Figure 1)

The most common main reasons given for not continuing in study were that young people wanted a break from study (for example to travel), were undecided and considering their options, or were not interested in further study. (Table 9)

Different people, different pathways

The survey found different patterns for different groups of young people.

Sex

There were differences in the destinations of males and females. In particular:

Females were more likely than males to enter a university degree course (45.3 per cent compared to 37.6 per cent of males), but less likely to enrol in VET programs (20.4 per cent compared to 29.1 per cent of males). (Table 2)

Males were seven times more likely than females to enter an apprenticeship, while females were more likely to commence a traineeship. (Table 2)

Females were more than three times as likely to study in the field of Education and twice as likely to study in the field of Health, Society and Culture, and Food, Hospitality and Personal Services. (Table 4)

Males were nearly nine times as likely as females to enrol in Engineering and Related Technologies courses, and nearly five times as likely to enrol in Information Technology and in Architecture and Building courses. (Table 4)

Females were more likely than males to be working in part-time jobs (70.6 per cent compared to 55.5 per cent), and just as likely to be working in full-time jobs (21.0 per cent compared to 21.3 per cent of males). (Table 6)

Students of VET in schools

Three in ten Year 12 graduates in this region left school with a VET qualification (37.6 per cent), while 6.3 per cent were school-based apprentices or trainees (SATs). (Table 12 and Table 13)

Those with a VET qualification were less likely to enrol in a university degree course than others (26.5 per cent compared to 50.6 per cent). However, they had higher rates of transition to employment-based training (18.2 per cent compared to 8.2 per cent). They were also more likely to enter employment with no further education and training (34.7 per cent compared to 22.9 per cent). (Table 12)

School-based apprentices and trainees were three times as likely to undertake apprenticeships and traineeships after school as other Year 12 completers (35.1 per cent compared to 10.4 per cent). (Table 13)

OP-eligible Students

Over half (57.9 per cent) of the OP-eligible Year 12 completers had commenced a university degree. Year 12 completers who were not OP-eligible were more than twice as likely to transition to VET programs (42.0 per cent) than OP eligible students (17.2 per cent). (Table 14)

Certificate of Post-Compulsory School Education

Year 12 completers who were awarded a Certificate of Post-Compulsory School Education (CPCSE) were more likely to enrol in VET courses (30.3 per cent) than those not awarded a certificate (24.6 per cent). In particular, they were nearly eight times more likely to enrol in VET Certificate I-II/other courses (23.9 per cent compared to 2.8 per cent for students who did not complete a CPCSE). CPCSE graduates were also seven times more likely to be either seeking work or not studying and not in the labour force. (Table 15)

Senior Certificate

Four in ten students (41.8 per cent) who were awarded a senior certificate enrolled in a university degree. Year 12 completers who were awarded a Senior Certificate were nearly twice as likely to be studying or in paid employment (93.8 per cent) as those who were not awarded a senior certificate (48.9 per cent). (Table 16)

Indigenous

Indigenous Year 12 completers were less likely than their non-Indigenous peers to enrol at university (21.7 per cent compared to 41.9 per cent). Nonetheless, 55 Indigenous young people who completed the survey commenced university studies in 2008. (Table 17)

Indigenous students were more than twice as likely to be a trainee (9.5 per cent compared to 4.0 per cent) and more likely to have a main destination of working (33.6 per cent compared to 27.2 per cent). (Table 17)

Indigenous Year 12 completers were just as likely as their non-Indigenous counterparts to enrol in campus-based VET courses (12.6 per cent compared to 12.7 per cent). (Table 17)

Indigenous Year 12 completers were more likely to be seeking work than their non-Indigenous peers (11.5 per cent compared to 5.0 per cent). (Table 17)

Language background other than English

Language background other than English (LBOTE) students were more likely to enrol at university (54.0 per cent compared to 40.2 per cent) and more likely to enrol in campus-based VET courses (17.9 per cent compared to 12.1 per cent). (Table 18)

LBOTE students were less likely to be in employment-based training (4.8 per cent compared to 12.7 per cent). They were also less likely to enter employment without further education and training (16.2 per cent compared to 28.5 per cent). (Table 18)

Socioeconomic status

Transition to post-school education and training was strongly associated with socioeconomic status (SES), increasing consistently from 55.3 per cent for the lowest SES quartile to 74.2 per cent for the highest SES quartile. (Table 19)

Regional comparisons

Year 12 completers in Brisbane had similar post-schooling destinations to all metropolitan Year 12 completers, although more were likely to enter university than Year 12 completers in Queensland generally. (Figure 2)

Year 12 completers not in education or training in Brisbane had similar destinations to metropolitan and statewide Year 12 completers. (Figure 5)

The occupations and industry categories of Year 12 completers in Brisbane were similar to those of Year 12 completers statewide. (Table 7 and Table 8)

The main reasons given for not studying by Brisbane Year 12 completers resemble those of metropolitan and statewide respondents. (Table 10)

The main reasons given for not seeking work by Brisbane Year 12 completers not in the labour market resemble those of metropolitan and statewide respondents. (Table 11)

Comparisons between the destinations of Year 12 graduates from Brisbane for the years 2005–08 reveal a broadly similar pattern, although the proportion entering VET Cert IV and above has declined and the proportions entering full-time and part-time jobs have increased. (Figure 4)

Main destinations

All respondents were categorised into their main destination, as outlined in Table 1. Tertiary students are assigned to the study categories regardless of their labour force status (i.e. they may also be working or even looking for work).

Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Brisbane, 2008

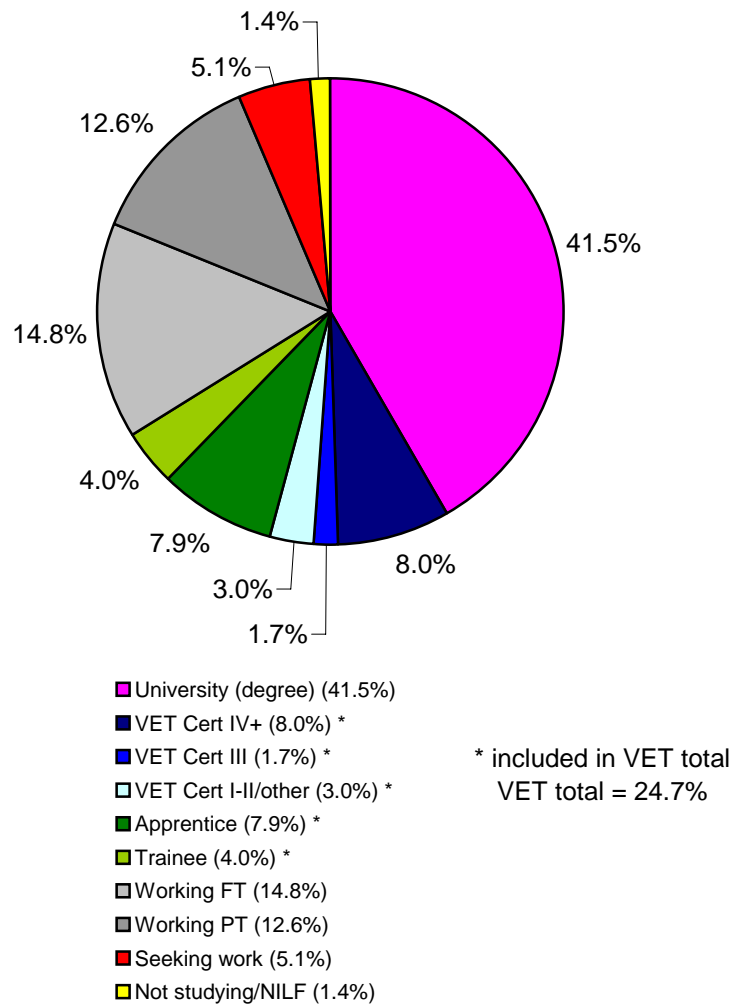

Figure 2 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

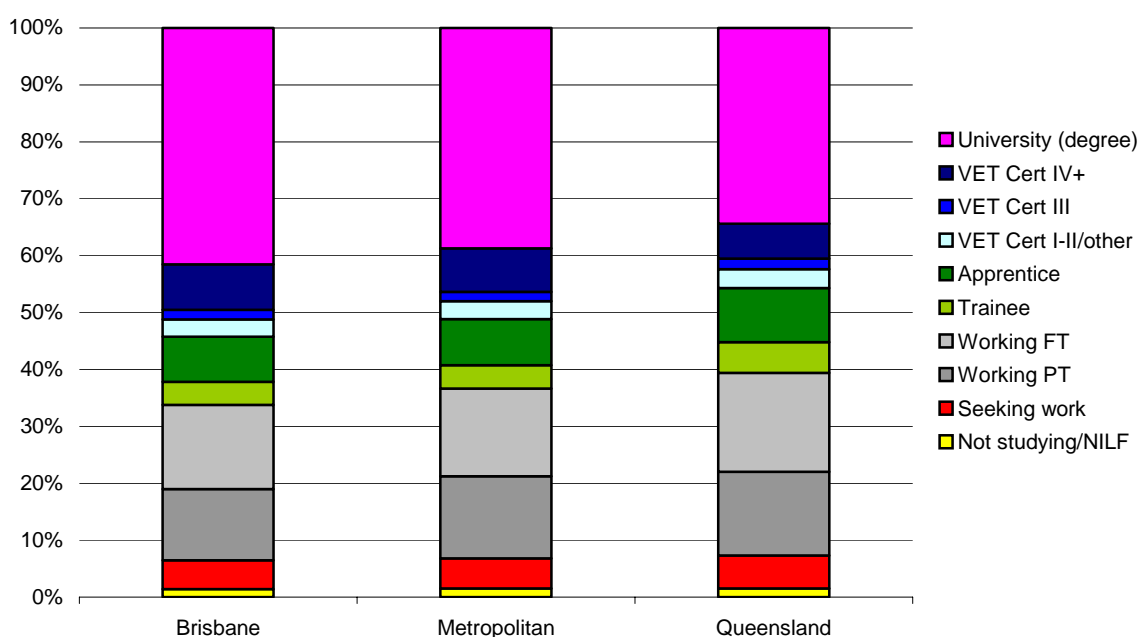
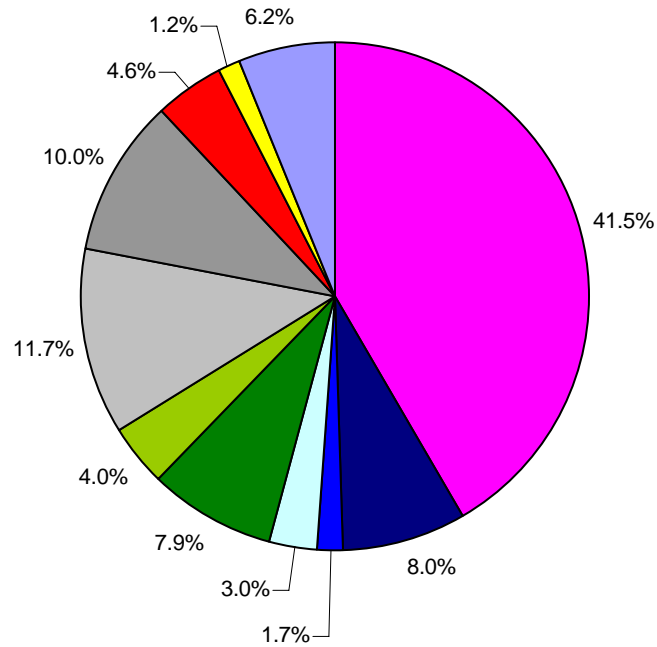

Figure 4 Comparison of main destinations of Year 12 completers, Brisbane, 2005 - 2008

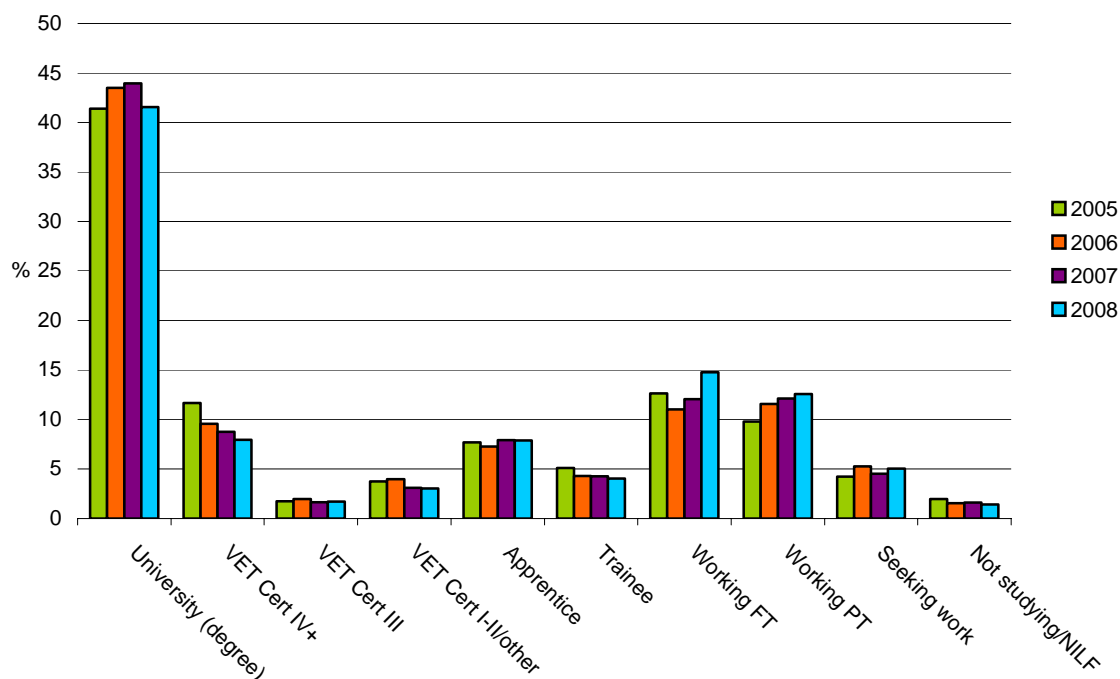

Figure 5 Main destinations of Year 12 completers not in education or training, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

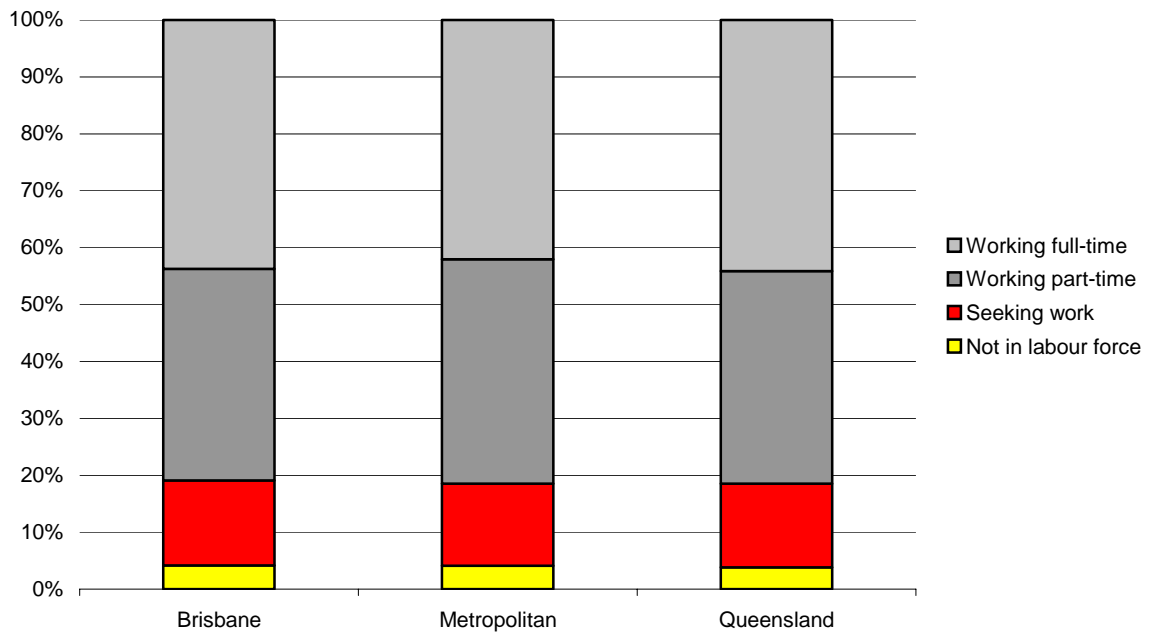

Figure 6 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Inner Brisbane, 2008

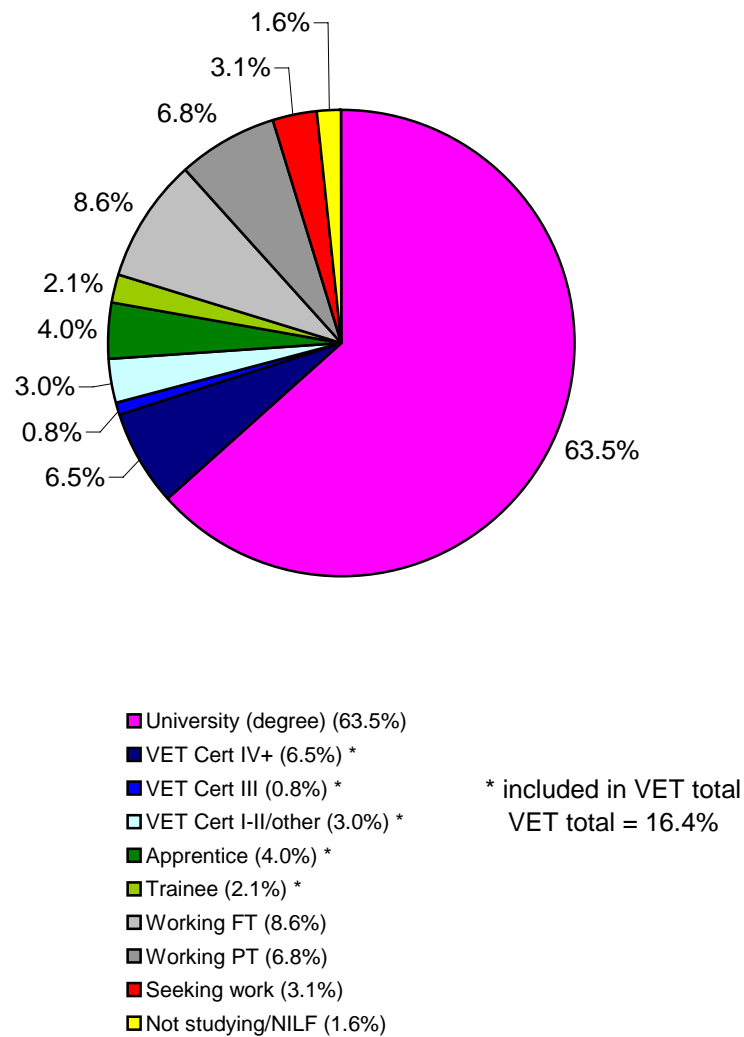

Figure 7 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Inner Brisbane, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

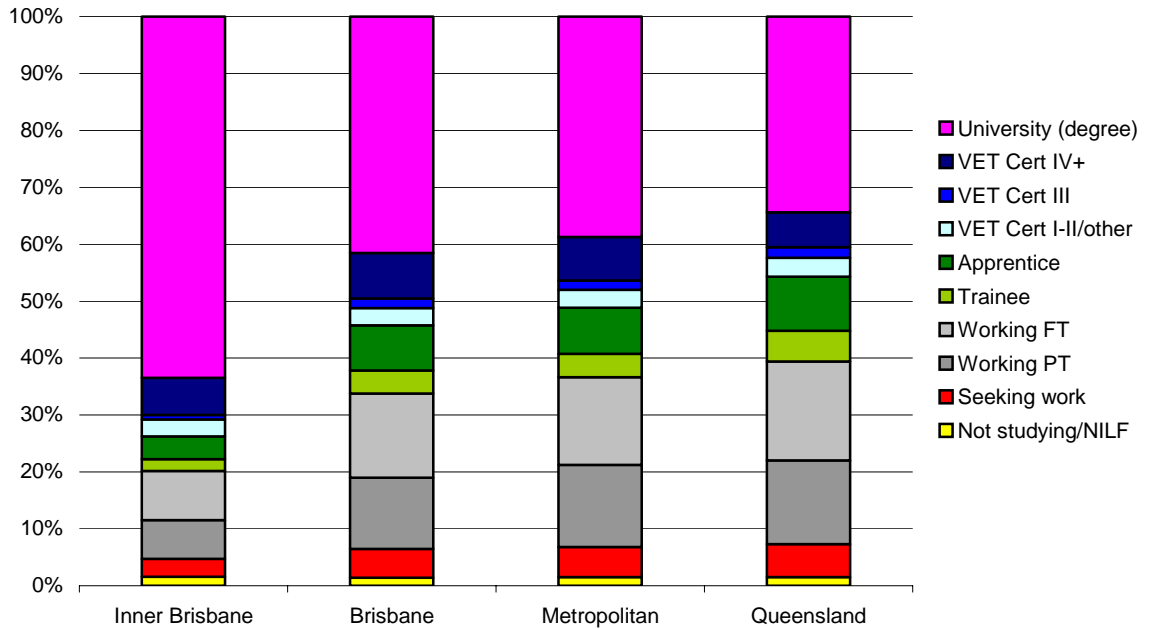
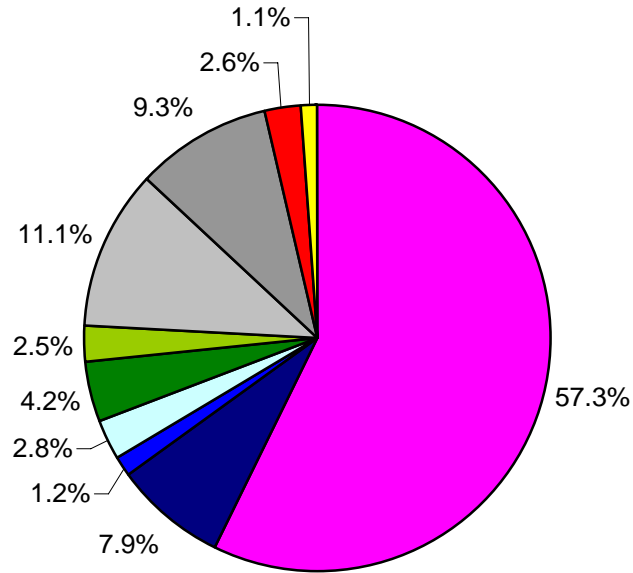

Figure 9 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Northwest Inner Brisbane, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

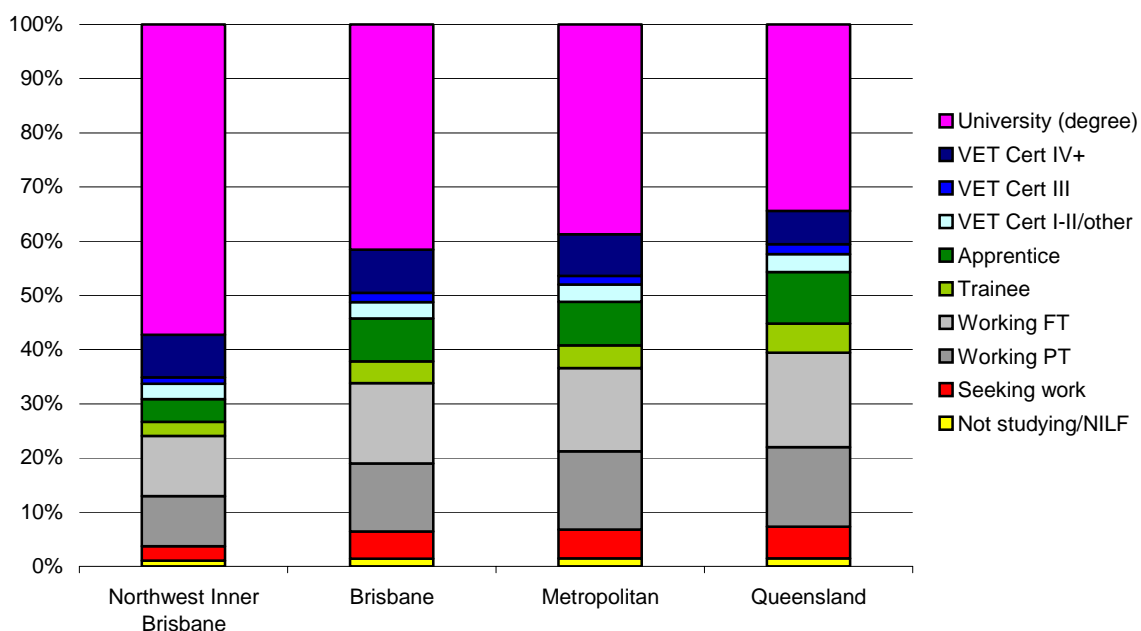

Figure 10 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Northwest Outer Brisbane, 2008

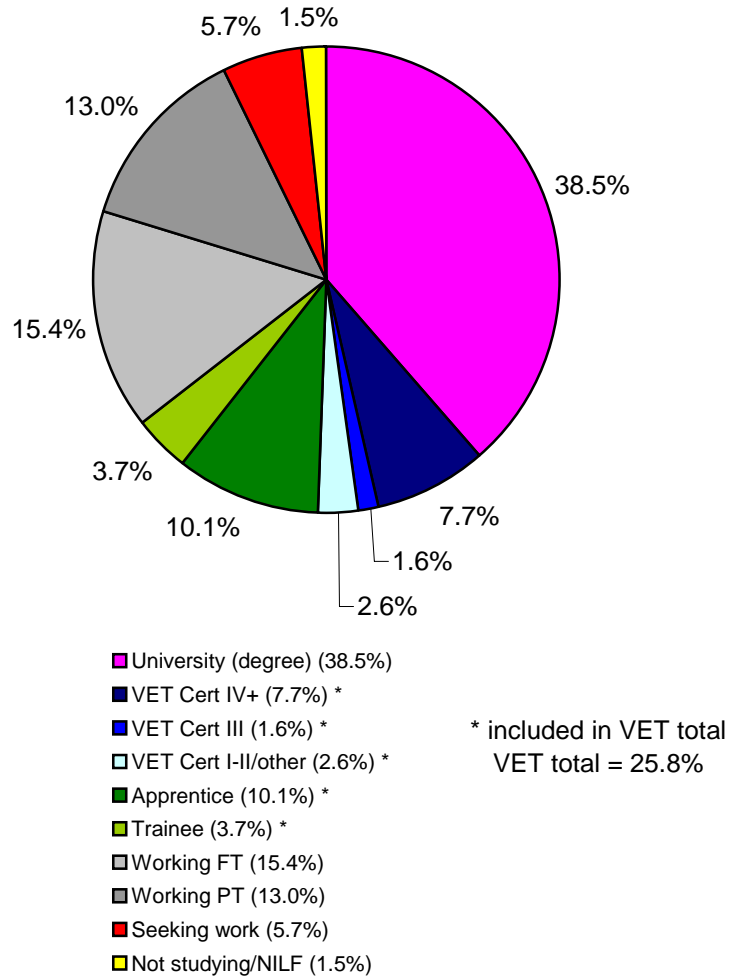

Figure 11 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Northwest Outer Brisbane, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

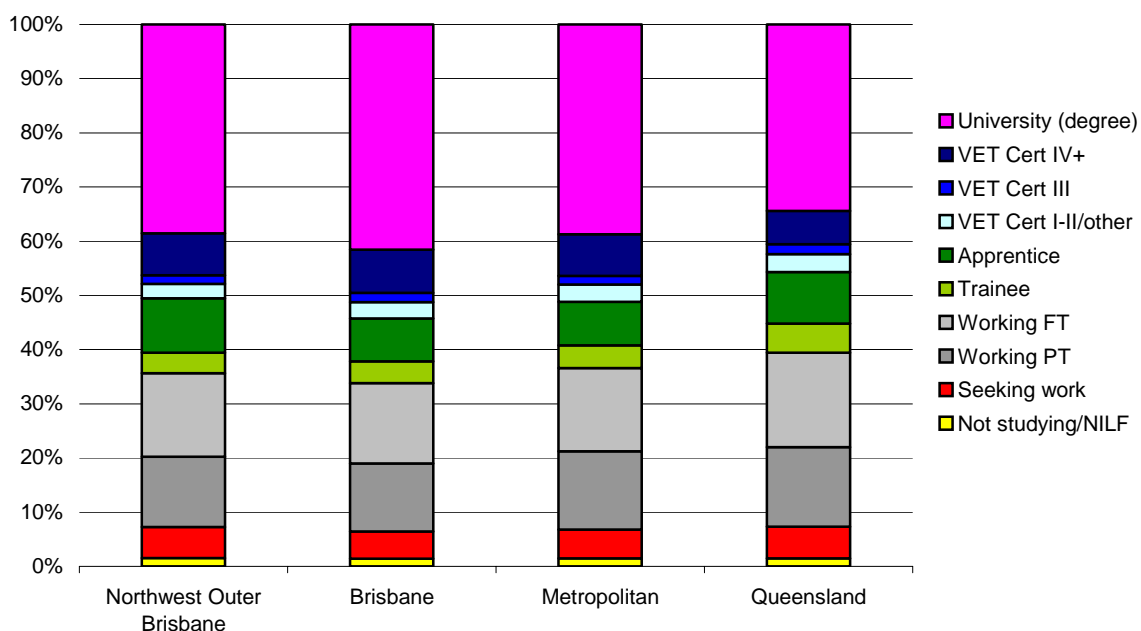

Figure 12 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Southeast Inner Brisbane, 2008

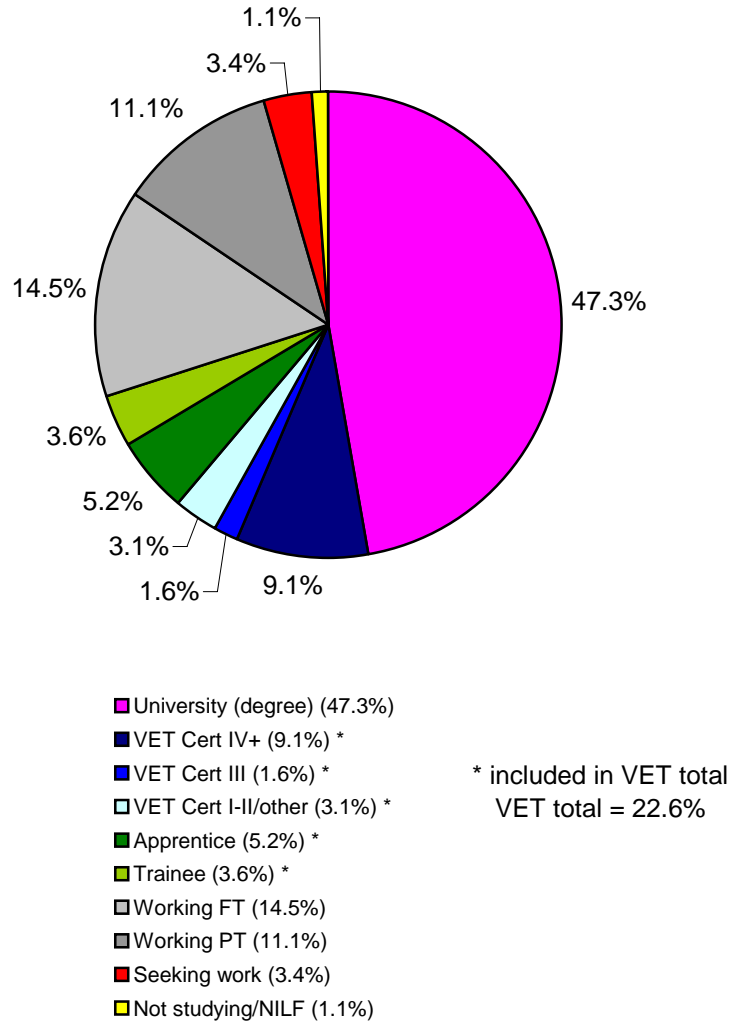

Figure 13 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Southeast Inner Brisbane, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

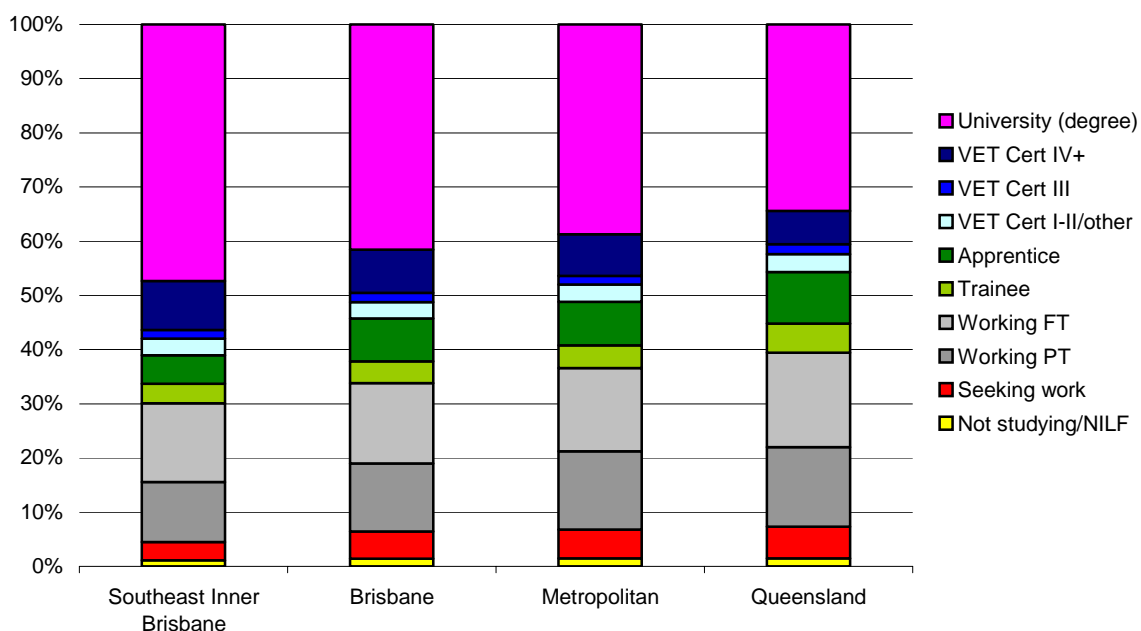

Figure 14 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Southeast Outer Brisbane, 2008

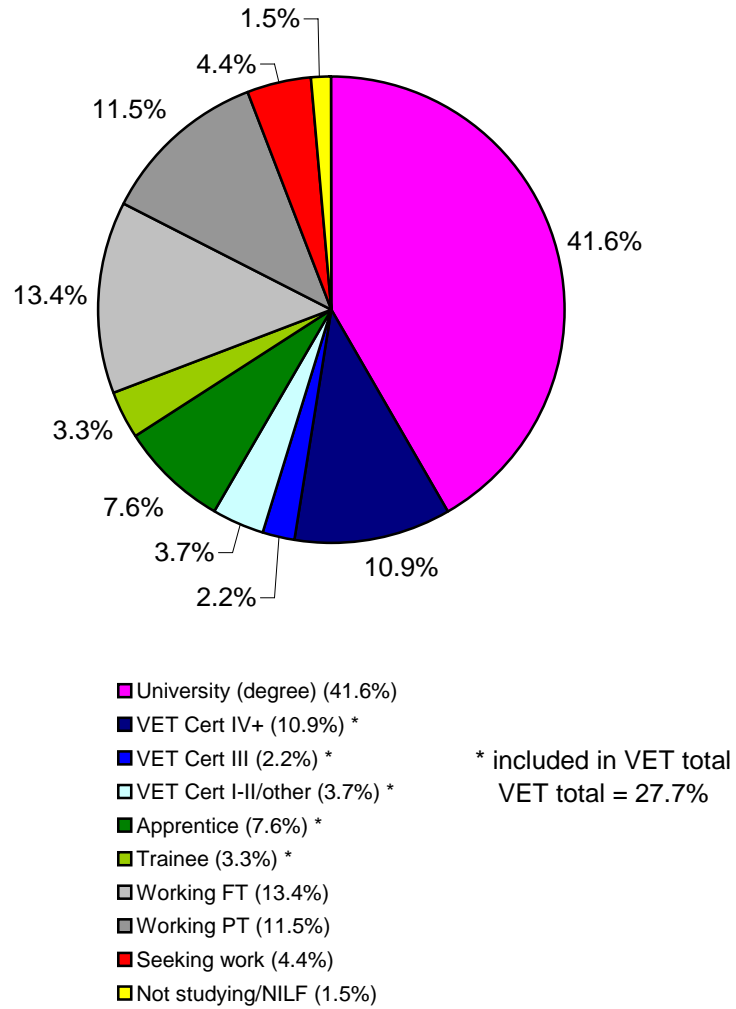

Figure 15 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Southeast Outer Brisbane, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

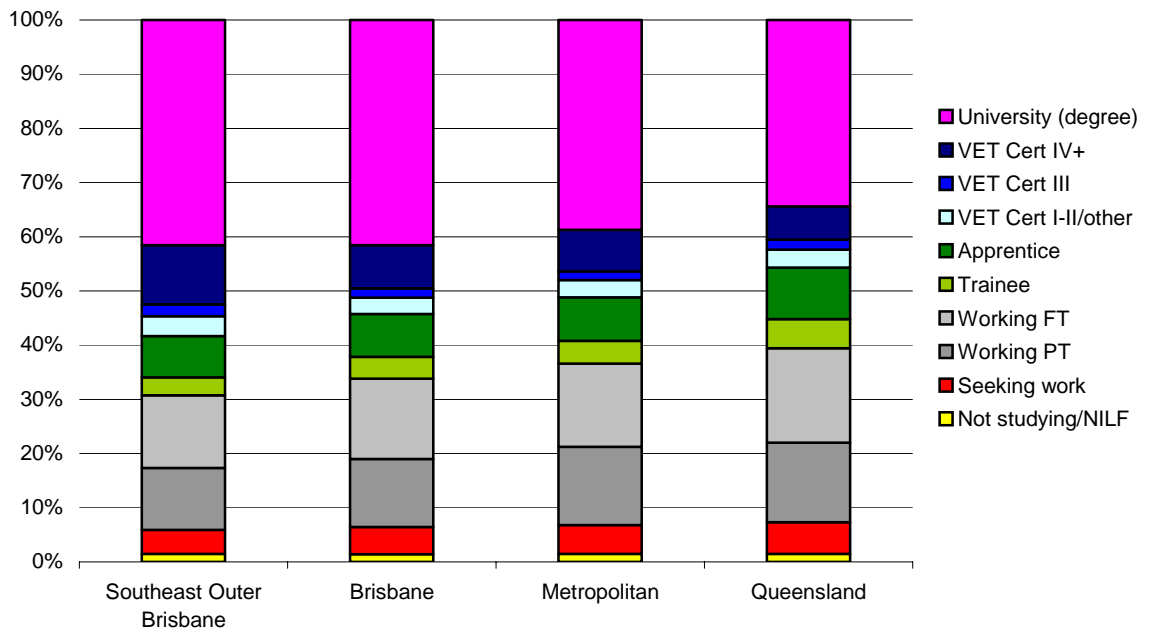
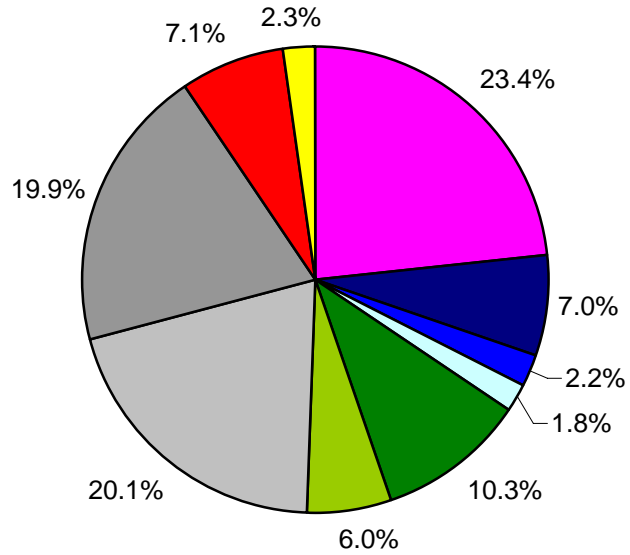

Figure 17 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Caboolture Shire, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

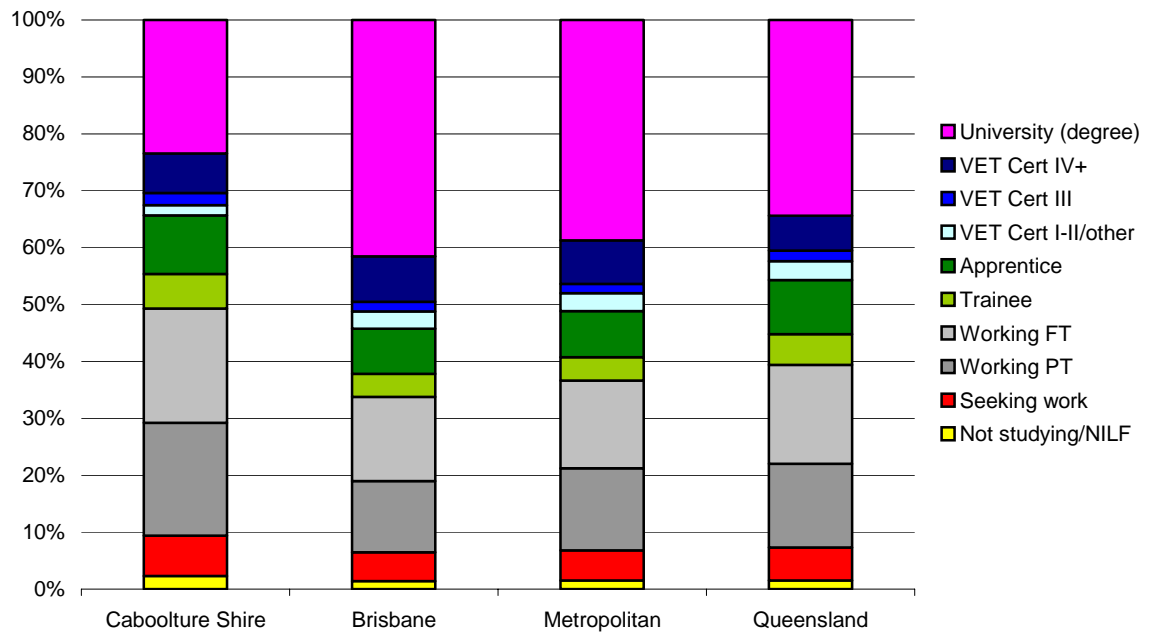
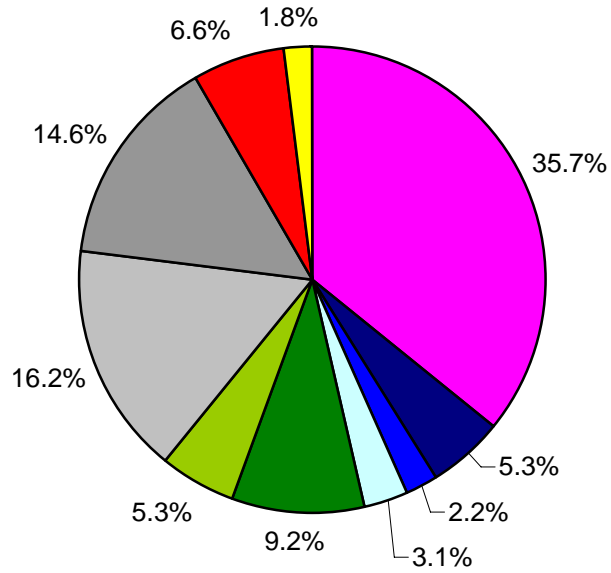

Figure 19 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Ipswich City, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

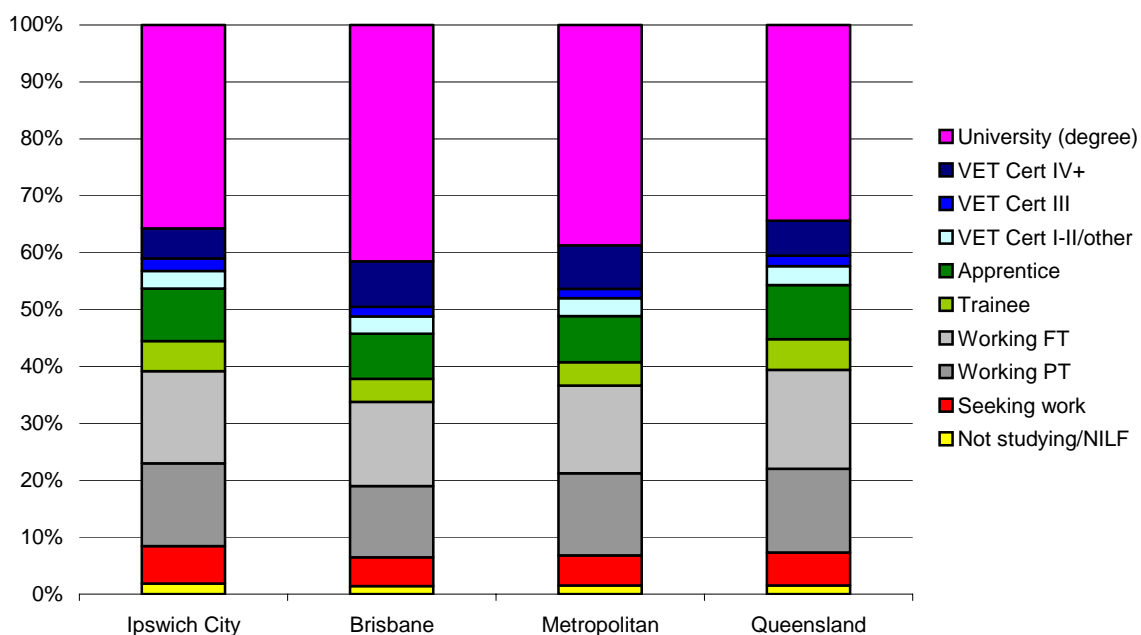

Figure 20 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Pine Rivers Shire, 2008

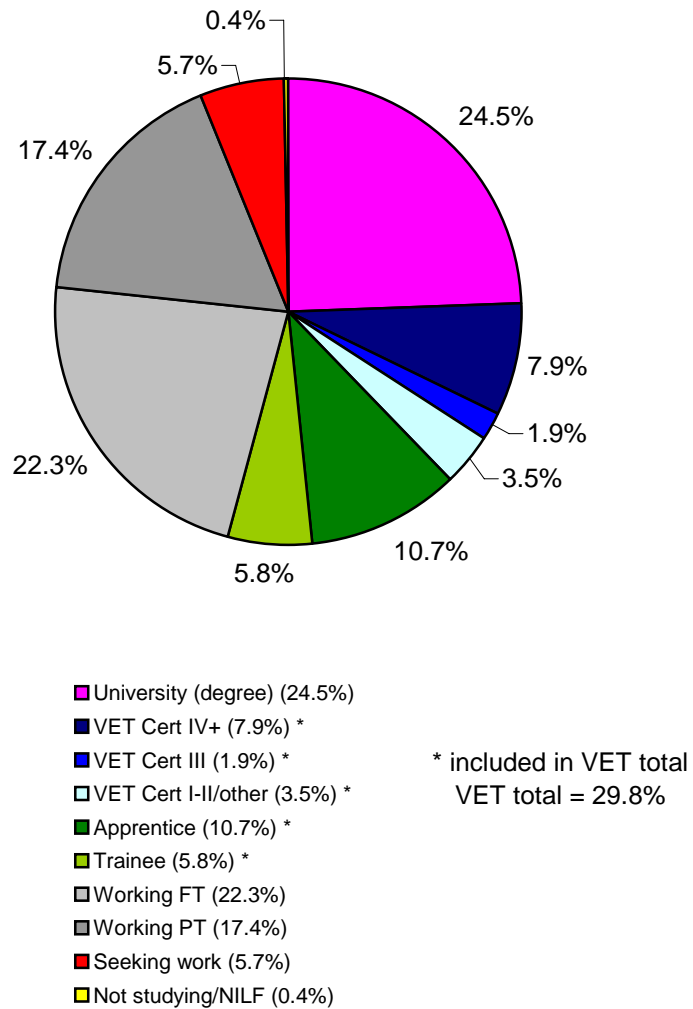

Figure 21 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Pine Rivers Shire, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

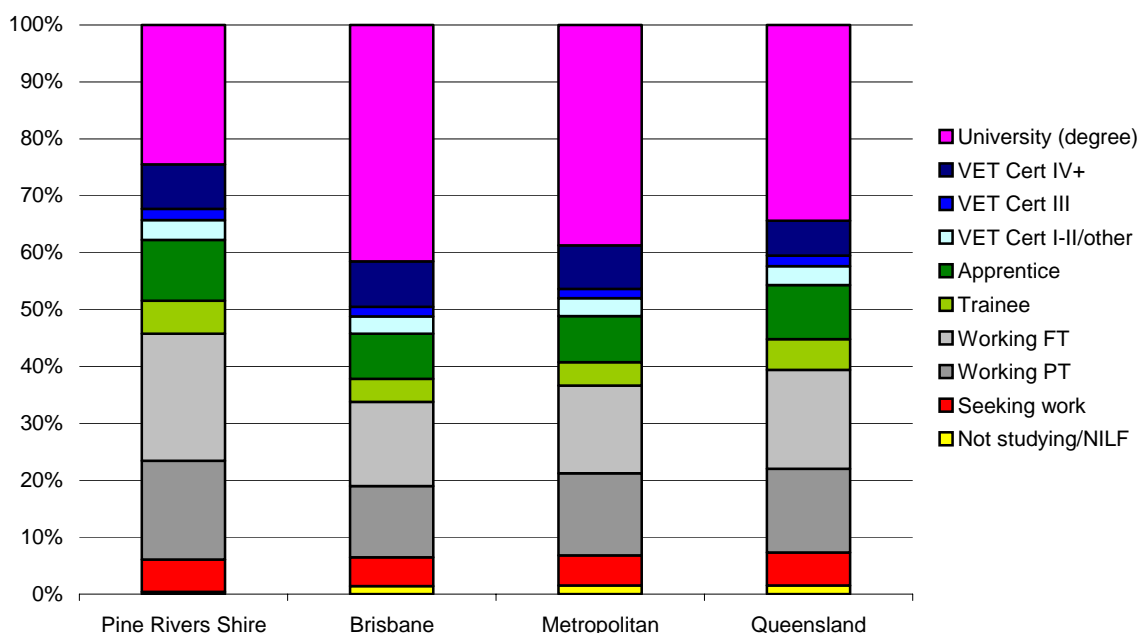

Figure 22 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Redcliffe City, 2008

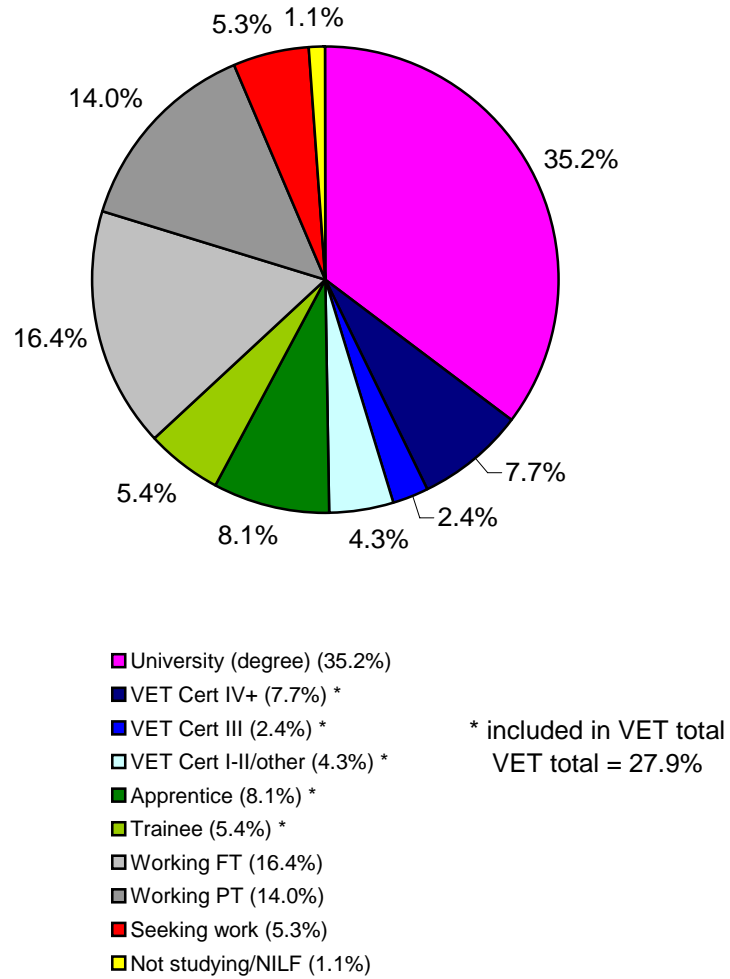

Figure 23 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Redcliffe City, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

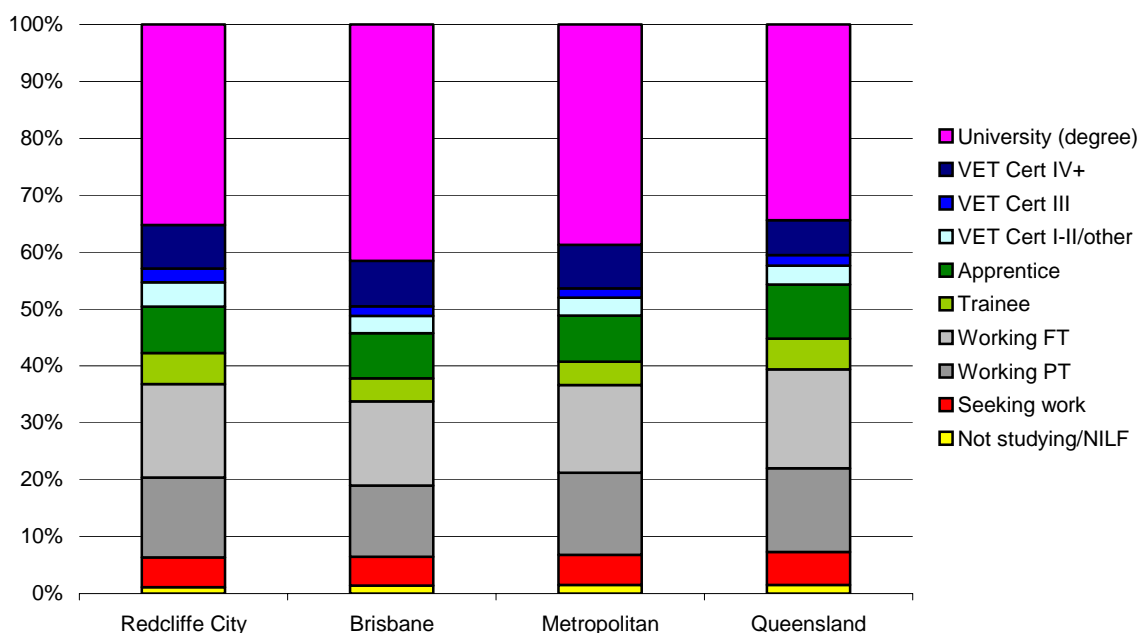

Figure 24 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Redland Shire, 2008

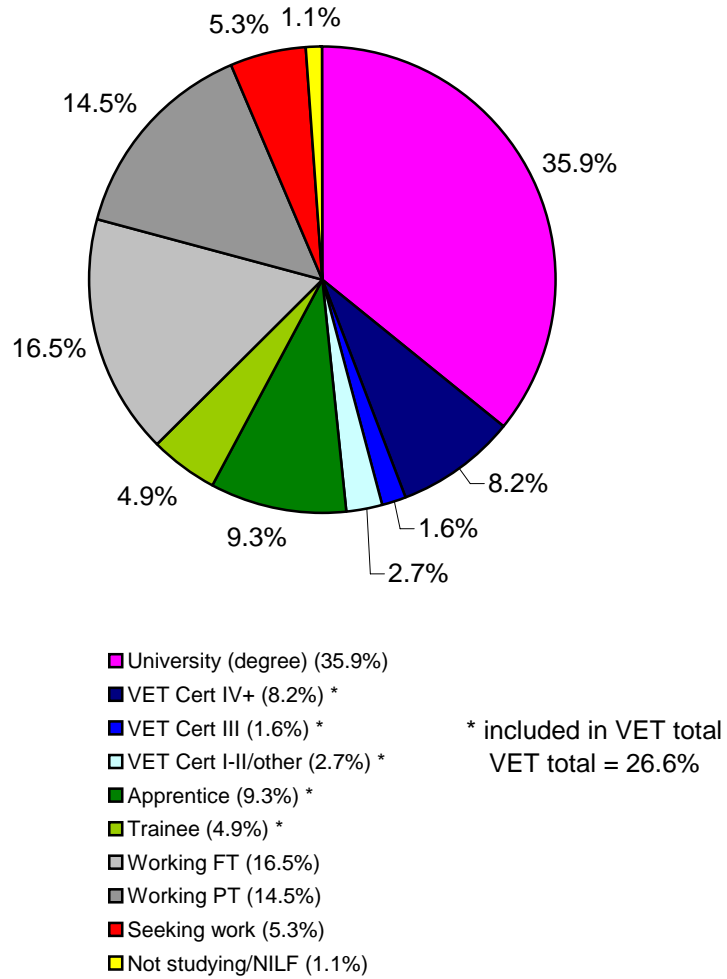

Figure 25 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Redland Shire, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

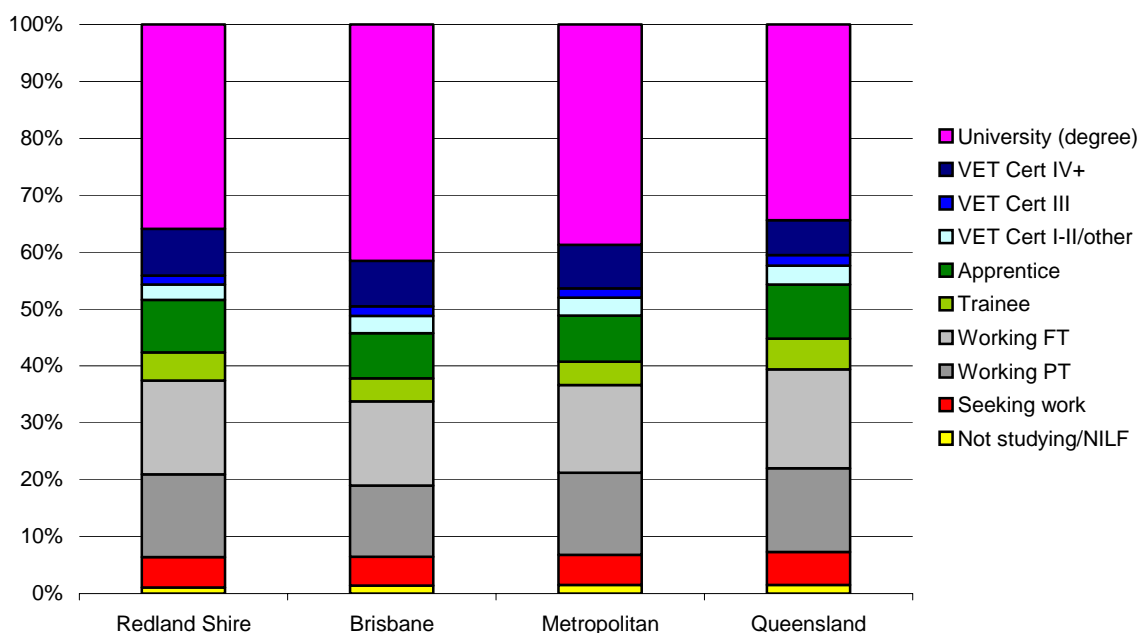
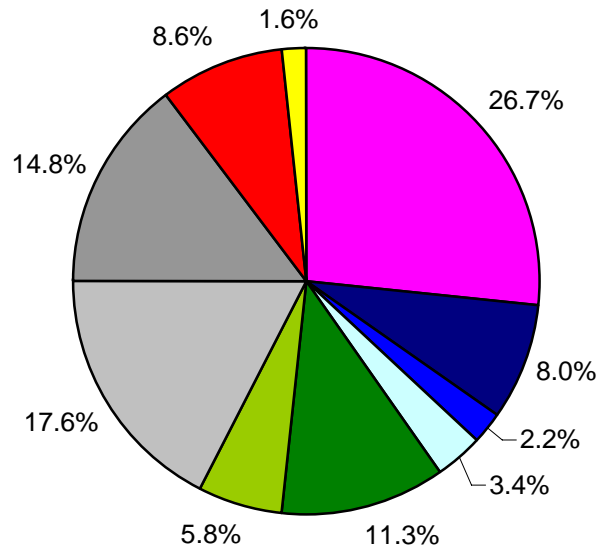

Figure 27 Main destinations of Year 12 completers, Logan City/Beaudesert Shire Part A, Brisbane, Metropolitan and Queensland, 2008

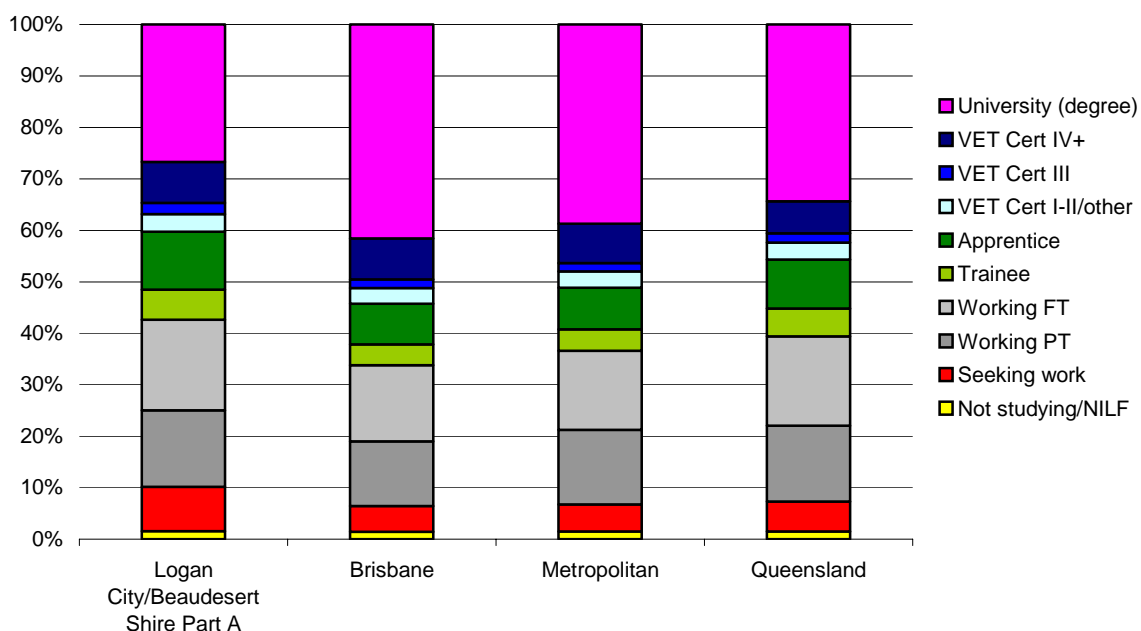

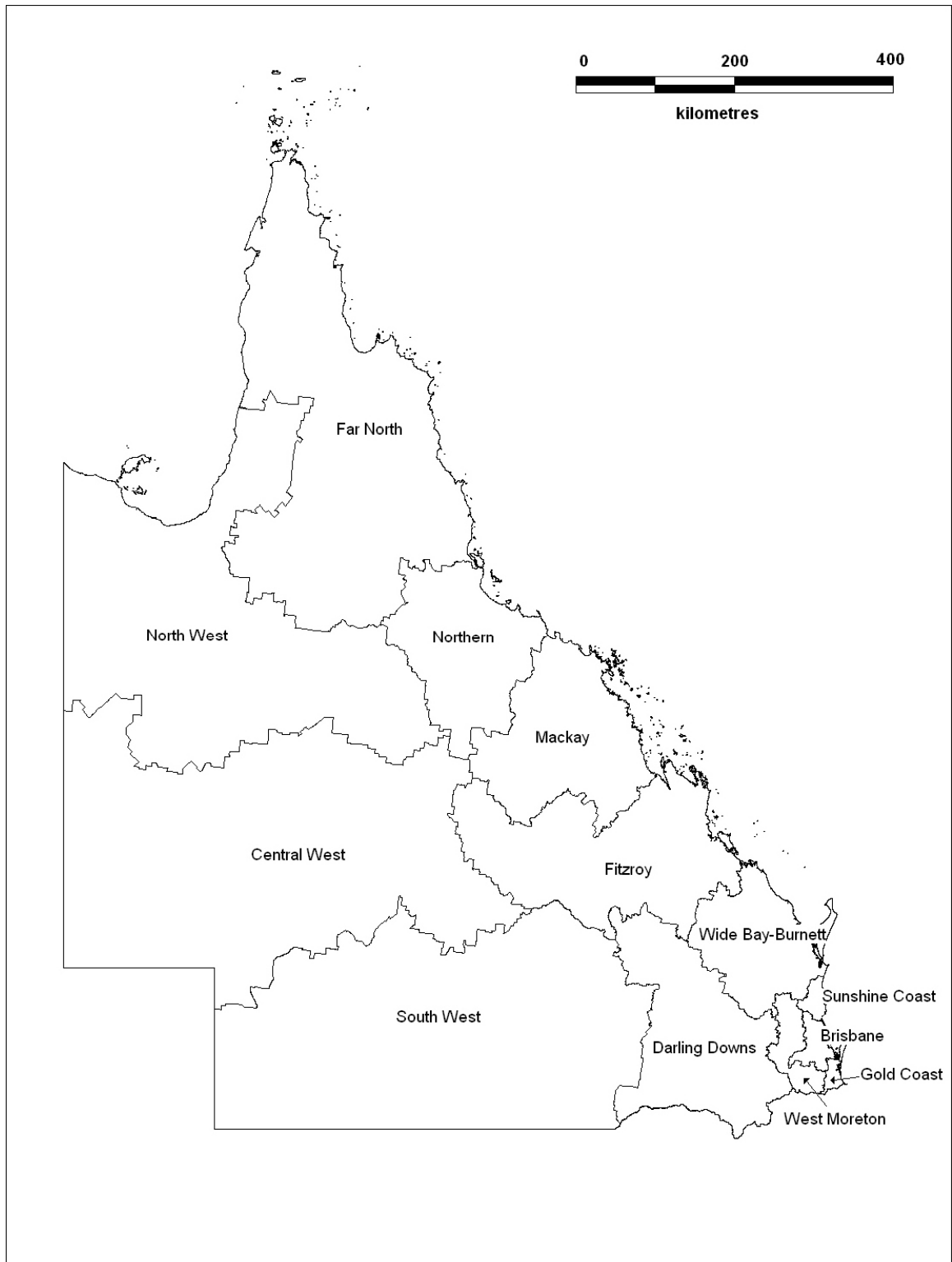


Figure A1B Brisbane, Gold Coast, Sunshine Coast and West Moreton Statistical Divisions, ABS, 2007
