

Purpose of survey

To assist:

- Parents and the wider public to know the achievements of students and to appreciate the range of options available to students
- Schools to review and plan their services for students
- School systems to review their education policies as they affect the transition from school to further study and employment
- Training bodies, universities, business and industry, local government and regional planners to plan their services.




Reporting 2006

- State-wide report
 - Print and available on the web
- Regional reports
 - Customised to eight regions
 - Available on the web
- School reports
 - Sent to individual schools
 - Assists in meeting schools reporting requirements

Methodology

- Targeted all students who completed Year 12 in 2005
 - Senior Certificate &/or CPCSE
- This amounted to more than 40,000 young people from over 400 schools across Queensland
- 30 989 respondents
- Predominantly telephone survey with some paperbased collection
- Conducted between March and May approximately 6 months after leaving school



Survey Management

- Reference Group comprised representatives of school sectors, principals' associations, QSA and DET, OGS and the University of Melbourne
- The survey was conducted by Office of Government Statistician
- Data analysed by the Centre of Post Compulsory Education and Life-long Learning at the University of Melbourne
- Managed by the Department of Education & The Arts




Definitions of Main Destinations


Higher Education	
University (degree)	Studying at degree level*
VET categories	
VET Cert IV+*	Studying Certificate IV, Diploma or Advanced Diploma (excluding apprentices and trainees).
VET Cert III*	Studying Certificate III (excluding apprentices and trainees)
VET Cert I-II/other*	Studying Certificate I or II (excluding apprentices and trainees). Also includes respondents in "unspecified" VET certificate, other basic courses or with unknown course level.
Apprentice	Working and in employment-based apprenticeship
Trainee	Working and in employment-based traineeship
No further education or training	
Working full-time	Working full-time (35 hours or more) and not in a study or training destination. This includes people with part-time or casual jobs that total 35 hours or more.
Working part-time	Working part-time or casual (fewer than 35 hours) and not in a study or training destination.
Seeking work	Looking for work and not in a study or training destination.
Not studying and not in the labour force	Not in study or training, not working and not looking for work. The



Main Destinations Queensland












Study and Labour Force destinations 2006






Main destinations with deferrals 2006

















Post-school level of study, by work status, Queensland, 2006






Work destinations of all Year 12 completers 2006






Work destinations of Year 12 completers in employment, by sex, 2006






Occupation of all Year 12 completers, by sex, 2006






Industry area of all Year 12 completers 2006







Industry area of Year 12 completers not in education or training, by FT/PT, 2006






Hours worked by Year 12 completers not in education or training, by sex, Queensland, 2006






Main reasons for not studying, by sex, 2006






Main reasons for not seeking work, Queensland, by sex, 2006







Main destinations of Year 12 completers by metro/non-metro, 2006






Main destinations of Year 12 completers by MCEETYA region, 2006





Main destinations of Year 12 completers by region, 2006



Destinations by Indigenous status, Queensland 2006





Comparison of Indigenous destinations, Metropolitan/non-Metropolitan & Queensland 2006





Destinations by LBOTE status, Queensland 2006






Destinations by SES, 2006






Destinations by OP eligibility and VET qualification status, Queensland 2006


