



## Indigenous Enrolments at Queensland State Schools, by Region

### Reports and statistics – August Census Collection

- A total of 39,357 full-time Indigenous students were enrolled in Queensland State Schools in August 2009.
- Enrolments in Queensland state schools continue to increase. From 2005 to 2010, Indigenous enrolments experienced an overall growth of 19.5 per cent. This growth is partly attributable to the introduction of the universally available prep year.
- Around a quarter (24.9 per cent) of Indigenous State school students were enrolled in schools in Far North Queensland, followed by North Queensland (16 per cent) and Metropolitan Region (13.3 per cent).
