



Indigenous Enrolments at Queensland State Schools, by Region

Reports and statistics – August Census Collection

- A total of 40,375 full-time Indigenous students were enrolled in Queensland State Schools in August 2010.
- Enrolments in Queensland state schools continue to increase. From 2006 to 2010, Indigenous enrolments grew overall by 17.1 per cent. This growth is partly attributable to the introduction of the universally available Prep Year.
- Around a quarter (24.7 per cent) of Indigenous State school students were enrolled in schools in Far North Queensland, followed by North Queensland (15.9 per cent) and North Coast Regions (13.5 per cent).
