



Indigenous Enrolments at Queensland State Schools, by Region

Reports and statistics - February Collection

- A total of 40,793 full-time Indigenous students were enrolled in Queensland state schools in February 2010.
- Enrolments in Queensland state schools continue to increase. From 2006 to 2010, Indigenous enrolments experienced an overall growth of 17 per cent. This growth is partly attributable to the introduction of the universally available prep year.
- Around a quarter (24.6 per cent) of Indigenous students were enrolled in schools in the Far North Queensland Region, followed by North Queensland (16.2 per cent) and Metropolitan Region (13.4 per cent).
