



Indigenous Enrolments at Queensland State Schools, by Region

Reports and statistics - February Collection

- A total of 41,888 full-time Indigenous students were enrolled in Queensland state schools in February 2011.
- Enrolments in Queensland state schools continue to increase. From 2007 to 2011, Indigenous enrolments experienced an overall growth of 11.0 per cent. This growth is partly attributable to the introduction of the universally available Prep Year.
- Around a quarter (24.5 per cent) of Indigenous students were enrolled in schools in the Far North Queensland Region, followed by North Queensland (15.9 per cent) and North Coast Region (13.6 per cent).
