



Historical Enrolments at Queensland State Schools, by Region

Reports and statistics

- Enrolments in Queensland State schools continue to increase. From 2004 to 2008 enrolments experienced an overall growth of 7 per cent.
- A total of 479,850 full-time students attended State schools in 2008.
- In 2008, 24.3 per cent of State School students attended schools in the Great Brisbane Region, followed by South Coast (15.8 per cent) and Sunshine Coast Regions (15.1 per cent).
