Our curriculum

The Australian Curriculum has been designed to give every student in Australia access to a flexible, modern curriculum that helps develop successful, confident and creative learners.

Queensland schools first introduced the Australian Curriculum in 2011.

In the same year, Queensland began developing our own suite of curriculum materials to help our schools and teachers deliver the Australian Curriculum.

Our focus

Curriculum into the Classroom (C2C) materials have been written by Queensland teachers, for Queensland students.

They give teachers and students a consistent approach to teaching and learning across the state.

No matter where our students live, our focus is to see *every student succeeding*.

C2C also supports Queensland's plans for full implementation of the Australian Curriculum by 2020.

Our materials

C2C resources have been written for all eight of the Australian Curriculum learning areas including:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Humanities and Social Sciences including History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship (from Year 3) and Economics and Business (from Year 5)
- · Health and Physical Education
- The Arts, including Dance, Drama, Media Arts, Music and Visual Arts
- Technologies; and
- Languages, including Chinese, French, German, Indonesian, Italian and Japanese.
