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Shanghai Sister Cities Youth Camp - Chaperone Application Portal

The Shanghai International Sister Cities Youth Camp, established in 2009, is an annual event that fosters meaningful connections between Shanghai and its international sister states and cities.

This dynamic camp offers Queensland Year 11 state school students a unique opportunity to immerse themselves in Chinese culture while enhancing their leadership abilities and Chinese language skills. Participants will engage in a variety of Chinese cultural activities designed to promote understanding and collaboration among youth from diverse backgrounds, including language learning, traditional and modern arts, sports and leisure activities, and city tours.

Through this program, students build lasting friendships and develop the knowledge, skills, attitudes and values needed to effectively engage and lead others in an increasingly interconnected world.

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Privacy Statement:

The Department of Education (the department) is collecting the personal information you provide on this form for the purpose of administrating the Shanghai Sister Cities Youth Camp (the program) application process. Your personal information will only be accessed by authorised employees within the department and supervising staff. Your personal information will be used by the department to communicate with you, for planning and organising the program, obtaining flights and travel insurance, making arrangements to cater for special requirements (where possible) and to assist the department and partner school to fulfil their duty of care. Should you wish to update your personal information, you may submit a request to the department at global.engagement@qed.qld.gov.au.

Some of your personal information will be disclosed to insurance organisations, tour operators, airlines, travel companies, accommodation providers, international partner organisations and other external parties involved in providing services to the group as part of the program. During this process, your personal information may be transferred overseas. Relevant personal information will be given to medical professionals in the event you require medical attention on the program or while in the care of the department.

At the end of the program, your personal information and associated data is stored securely by the department on servers that are located on shore in Australia. 
Next Steps:

- A Project Officer will send you a confirmation email after reviewing your application. You will be required to sign the **Applicant Declaration, Acknowledgement and Consent Form** at this point.
- Please allow up to 5 business days to receive the confirmation email.
- Once all applications are processed, a panel will review and shortlist.

- All applicants will be notified of the outcome from the shortlisting stage via email.
- If shortlisted, a Project Officer will:
 - Contact your supporting supervisor (*Principal or delegate*) to endorse your application and suitability for the program.
 - Contact your Principal who will be required to sign the Principal
 Statement Approval for Participation in the Program form.
- Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an interview with a selection panel.
- Interviews will be conducted online via Microsoft Teams.
- All interviewed applicants will be notified of the outcome via email from the Director, Global Engagement.
- Further details about the selection process can be found in the Chaperones: Conditions of Entry, Program Rules and Privacy Statement.


