

State Schools **Nursing Service**



The Department of Education is committed to creating healthy, inclusive, welcoming, and accessible learning environments. The State Schools Nursing Service (SSNS) assists schools so that students with health support needs can safely access and fully participate in school life.

What is the State Schools Nursing Service?

State schools registered nurses (SSRNs) employed by the department, assist schools to assess student health needs, develop health plans and provide training that builds the capability and confidence of school staff in providing student health supports. Ongoing support and refresher training is also available.

By working collaboratively with students, their families, school staff and treating health teams, SSRNs help minimise the impact of the student's health needs on their learning.

Who do nurses support?

SSNS provides support and training for schools or early childhood development programs with students who:

- require a specific health procedure
- require health intervention during school hours
- whose health condition is not easily managed without consultation and support from a nurse.

What services are available?

Building and maintaining school capability to support student inclusion and safety is a high priority. Nursing services are available to support a range of health conditions such as (but not limited to):

- enteral device feeding/medication administration e.g. gastrostomy/nasogastric tube
- urinary catheterisation or urostomy/Mitrofanoff support
- airway/breathing support e.g. tracheostomy and oral/nasal suctioning
- oxygen therapy/oxygen concentrator support
- stoma or collection bag/attachment device e.g. for colostomy/ileostomy
- diabetes support including glucose monitoring, insulin administration, and glucagon injection (where required)
- seizure support and seizure first aid, this includes administration of emergency medication such as Midazolam
- complex asthma, allergy and anaphylaxis support.

SSRNs are also available for practical training in the use of adrenaline auto-injectors (e.g. Anapen®/EpiPen®) and asthma first aid (e.g. reliever medication).

How are nursing services requested?

Parents should discuss their child's health supports with their child's school.

The principal (or delegate), in consultation with the parent or carer, will determine if services are required and complete a Nursing service request form. Schools can access this form on the department's OnePortal therapy and nursing page (search 'Nursing request'). SSRNs will determine if the referral meets the eligibility criteria for service provision.

Questions about services or the request/referral process should be directed to a local SSRN or the Regional Clinical Nurse Consultant (nursing supervisor). Contact details are contained in this brochure.



Who do SSRNs liaise with?

With permission from the student (where capable), parent or carer, the SSRN will liaise and work collaboratively with:

- **the student's doctor or treating health team** to understand the specifics of the student's health support needs and to develop the student's individual or emergency health plan
- **the classroom teacher and other supporting school staff** to ensure the student's health needs are understood
- **relevant allied health professionals**
- **school leaders** to support students with specific health needs, including when transitioning from early years to primary and on to high school.

What support is available for school camps, excursions and off-site activities?

When planning for camps and excursions, SSRNs are able to provide additional support including:

- advice for risk assessment e.g. camp checklists, camp plans, additional training
- training for procedures normally attended to at home
- liaison with the student's treating health professionals regarding risk management
- development of camp specific health plans.

Note: For the best outcome, please contact the SSRN early in the planning phase.

Is there a cost for nursing services?

The department provides nursing services at no cost to schools or families. The service is focused on supporting reasonable adjustments to enable students to participate and learn on the same basis as all other students.
