Research priorities



The research priorities provide a framework for the generation of research about and evidence to inform Queensland's educational context.

The research priorities:

- inform decisions about research activities and investment;
- encourage internal and external researchers to investigate critical areas of relevance to the Department of Education;
- · prompt research in emerging areas; and
- contribute to driving equity and excellence in schools and across our system.

The research priorities are aligned with and underpinned by the Department of Education *Equity & Excellence: realising the potential of every student* strategy, and extend across educational leaders, educators, children and young people in early childhood and school contexts. They support the Equity & Excellence focus areas of:



• **Educational achievement:** Knowing each student's learning progress is essential to making sure they are on track for positive educational outcomes. Setting clear expectations for every student and every school supports them to achieve.



Wellbeing and engagement: Being healthy, confident and resilient is a foundation for
engaging in learning. With a focus on wellbeing of all staff and students, we create a
sense of belonging and a positive environment for teaching and working. Designing and
delivering meaningful pathways for every student is key to lifting learning outcomes.



Culture and inclusion: The diversity of our staff, students and school communities is
our greatest strength. By valuing culture and creating inclusive teaching and learning
environments, we are driving equity and excellence across every state school.

The research priorities consist of five research themes and 14 broad research topics, drawn from *Equity & Excellence* system initiatives and school priorities. The school priorities are underpinned by curriculum, teaching and learning, and encompass the following four phases:



• **Starting strong**: Strengthening protective factors in the early years to improve outcomes and make a positive impact on young people's lives.



• **Building on foundations:** Consolidating strong foundations for lifelong learning and nurturing confidence of students to thrive in their future schooling years.



• On track for success: Recognising changing needs and supporting every student to stay on track with positive transitions from upper primary through junior secondary.



• **Ready for the future:** Preparing every student for their future and supporting positive transitions from school onto their next steps into further education and employment.
