1. Do I?

- use a range of data to understand each of my student's engagement and academic needs?

2. Does my school?

- have systems for collecting data, and routines to analyse that data, so we can identify students who are disengaged or at risk of disengagement?

3. Do we?

- capture student voice in our data to inform our priorities and practices
- have the expertise to analyse the data we collect
- combine our data so we have the full picture of where each student is at
- use data to inform whole-team approaches to support our students
- use additional data collection tools to address data gaps
- maintain student privacy and dignity when we share data
- store data securely.
